Parish Registration


Ouestion:

Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Answer:

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.



St. Bernadette Soubirous | April 16

At the age of 14 St. Bernadette (1844-1879) was living in abject poverty with her family in a one-room basement which had previously been used as a jail, in the town of Lourdes in southern France. She was a sickly child, having fallen victim to Cholera in 1854 and would battle asthma and tuberculosis for the rest of her short life. Bernadette was illiterate and is characterized in many accounts as slow or ignorant. It was in her 14th year that Bernadette was granted 18 visions of a 'Lady' at a grotto in Massabielle. The Lady instructed Bernadette to come daily to the grotto to receive the visions, eventually proclaiming 'I am the Immaculate Conception'. A spring at the grotto, which appeared where Bernadette was instructed to dig, has been a site of miraculous healing. The Lady also asked that a chapel be built in the grotto for pilgrims. Today the Marian shrine at Lourdes is one of the world's most popu-

During and following the period of visions, the saint was examined rigorously by Church and local authorities. The popular excitement around the visions left her subject to persistent questioning and attention. Eventually she sought protection by retiring to a home for the poor in a nunnery. She took her vows in 1866 with the Sisters of Charity at Nevers. She worked as an infirmary assistant, and later a sacristan, but by the end of her life she was too sick to participate in convent life. She died at the age of 35, humble and penitent until the end.. ©LPi

Beloved in Christ,

Thanks for your prayers! Every year at the Chrism Mass, at the Cathedral Basilica, we priests take the opportunity to renew our promises to the Archbishop. In so doing, we also renew our dedication to sanctify the people of God, teach the Faith and shepherd the people of the world. Even though our Chrism Mass has been on Tuesday of Holy Week since I can remember, the traditional time for it is the morning of Holy Thursday. Jesus instituted the ministerial priesthood on Holy Thursday thus giving the setting and opportunity for the renewal. I understand, one reason our Chrism Mass is on Tuesday of Holy Week rather than Thursday is to allow enough time for the distribution of the holy oils to the parishes for the Sacred Triduum, which begins on the night of Holy Thursday.

Beginning today with the commemoration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the liturgies of this week are packed with meaning and significance leading us into commemoration of His Passion. The high point is the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus at the Easter Vigil. At this liturgy, we will also welcome new members into the Church.

Once again, the liturgical books remind me to remind the faithful with some words from the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council: "Pastors should remind the faithful of the paschal fast which should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and continued, where possible, on Holy Saturday. In this way, the people of God will receive the joys of the Lord's Resurrection with uplifted and responsive hearts."

Thanks again for your prayers. Be assured of my daily prayers for you.



The Kreidler Family Educational Gift

The Kreidler Family Educational Gift is an annual award that recognizes an active St. Margaret of York youth parishioner who lovingly reaches out to others in the name of Christ. This youth is a current or incoming high school student who demonstrates a willingness to serve others at SMOY and the community at large. Additional characteristics taken into consideration are participation in our parish activities and sound academic standing.

Each year, SMOY's Pastoral Council will accept applications for this educational gift. The amount of the gift is \$1000 and, when awarded, shall be applied directly towards tuition expenses for a Catholic high school. The gift is nonrenewable, but may be awarded to the same St. Margaret of York youth parishioner a maximum of four times. SMOY's Pastoral Council will determine the recipient, taking into account the characteristics described above. The parish office will be responsible for overseeing the financial aspects of the gift. The recipient will be recognized in May and the award money will be sent directly to the youth's Catholic school of choice.

The Knights of Columbus is a global Catholic fraternal service order founded in 1882. Our membership is limited to Catholic men. It was established for working-class and immigrant Catholics in the US and has grown to support refugee relief, Catholic education, local parishes and global Catholic social and political causes. Recently, the Knights world-wide have donated over \$185 million dollars and 76 million volunteer hours toward charity projects. Presently there are nearly two million Knights.

I personally joined the Knights in 1972 in Illinois. My father joined the Knights soon after returning from Europe and WW II and encouraged me to become part of this organization and I am glad I did. The men I have met in our council here at SMOY alone have made me a better person as well as a better Catholic. It is nice to see other Knights at Mass and to be greeted with a firm handshake. You know you are in the right place. Some of the more famous Knights are President John Kennedy, Vince Lombardi, Babe Ruth, Dan Daly (a two time Medal of Honor recipient), Floyd Patters (former heavyweight champion), and Samuel Alito (US Supreme Court Judge).

Each year the Knights of SMOY participate in the March for Life in Washington, D.C., the E6 Men's Conference, the Freestore Food Bank and the Ron-

ald McDonald House. We are one of the few councils who have purchased more than one ultrasound machine. Our social events include the upcoming golf outing in June, our recently held annual Euchre Tournament, as well as the Knights Free Throw contest for the kids at school. Our Trunk or Treat event each year at Halloween is always a big hit. Each month, our social meeting includes a quest speaker. Recently we had Rocky Boiman, former Notre Dame football captain as well as a Super Bowl player, and Peter Sorentino from Fox Business news. In January we had Robert Bilott from the Taft law firm. His story is in the movie DARK WATERS. In May we will have David Szeremt, JD, CLU, CHFC, national speaker on wills, trusts and estate planning.

On a more recent acknowledgment, when the Ukranian refugees are leaving their home land and entering Poland, The Knights of Columbus are the first to greet them with food, clothing and warm shelter. This is the Knights of Columbus mission.

The Knights organization is open to all Catholic men. We encourage every Catholic man to join our ranks. Each of us brings a skill to help others.



Online PRP

When: Access to Course Content begins in June 2022

Our Online PRP is a flexible program is designed to equip parents to thrive in their natural vocation as the first Catechist and teacher of the faith to their children. The curriculum is Ignatius Press Life In Christ but instead of purchasing the physical books, Ignatius Press has partnered with Our Catholic Faith Delivered which allows for a complete, online approach to home study faith formation.

The students have access to their grade level materials online for a 1 year period and have the ability to complete the coursework at their own pace. All assessments and prayer exercises are completed through the online platform so that both the parents and our Faith Formation office can monitor progress in knowledge of the faith and relationship with Christ.

Sunday PRP

When: Sunday Mornings, September 2022 - April 2023

Sunday PRP uses the Graded Course of Study established by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, which encompasses the 7 tasks of catechesis: Prayer, Knowledge of the Faith, Liturgical Life, Moral Formation, Communal Life, Missionary Spirit, and Theology of the Body. Students will have the opportunity to talk about their faith with classmates their own age and with a devoted catechist.

Family Faith

When: 3rd Sunday of Month, September 2022 - April 2023

Family Faith brings St. Margaret of York families together once a month to learn about the life of Jesus Christ, His teachings, our Catholic Faith, and helping families pass on a living faith. At home, parents will foster their relationship with Christ and help their children fall in love with Jesus as they journey toward Heaven as a family. On one Sunday of each month, families meet together to experience our Faith through teaching, discussion, and activities. The discussion and activities are broken up into age groups such as Parents (Adults), High School Age, Jr High Age, Middle School, Primary, and preschool, depending on the number of families who register.

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

A God Who Knows How It Feels

Christ could have spoken anything from the cross, so why did he choose to recite Psalm 22? And why is it so important that we recite that same Psalm at todav's Mass?

"My God, my God, why have You abandoned me?"

We've never known the Jesus of the Gospels to doubt the will of God. We've never known him to be a defeatist or to give into feelings of despair. He's the hero who walks on water, the Savior who is welcomed to Jerusalem with a pathway of palms. And he knows how this story ends; he knows full well that his Father has absolutely not abandoned him.

So why does he say this? Jesus doesn't make offhanded comments, especially in his last hour. Today, when we repeat the words that he calls out in his darkest moment, we must remember that he wants us, very particularly, to consider them.

With his crucifixion, Jesus reminds us of his humanity. He is a man of flesh that can be torn and blood that can be shed. Somehow, in tandem with his divinity, he still possesses a heart that knows fear and pain and longing. And with this seemingly hopeless cry, he reminds us of that.

Let us never doubt that Jesus can relate to us in our brokenness. This is the week, friends. This is the week that reminds us that our God is a God who knows every pang, every trembling, and every uncertainty of human life. Our God knows what abandonment feels like. He knows what rejection feels like. He knows what it is to keep going when the strength and the will has disappeared.


