
Q&A Fruits of Holy Communion

Question:

What are the "fruits" of holy Communion? Answer:

The Eucharist, like all sacraments, offers its own unique grace. We receive a special share in God's life that helps us in our faith journey. We are given all we need to sustain and nurture our relationship with God. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. Everything we are and everything we hope to become is found in this sacrament. It is essential to the life of the church, to each member of the church. Without it, there is no church. The Eucharist is the center of our spiritual life and has enormous effects on our growth, our holiness, and our way of life.

The fruits of holy Communion are the benefits one receives from the sacrament. These fruits of holy Communion are discussed in the catechism in the article on the Eucharist. The primary benefit is union with Christ. We become one with him sacramentally, just as we hope to become one with him for eternity. The Eucharist also separates us from sin, both past and future. It forgives the venial sins of the past and, by the love we receive, protects us from mortal sin in the future. The church community is also unified and strengthened by the Eucharist. It unites us to the poor and offers the pledge of eternal life. ©I Pi



St. Anselm | April 21

St. Anselm of Canterbury left his home in Italy to travel as a young man and ended up at the monastery in Bec, France, which was known for the teachings of its leader, Lanfranc. Anselm rose quickly to become abbot of the community and his writings are now compared in importance to those of St. Augustine.

In 1093 Anselm was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury by William II Rufus, the son and successor of William the Conqueror. However, at the time there was a controversy in Europe over whether kings or the pope had the power to invest bishops. Anselm, who believed only the pope should have the right to invest an ecclesiastical authority, spent much of his time as Archbishop exiled in Rome.

St. Anselm's teaching and works of theology are his most important contribution to the Catholic faith. He is considered of the fathers of scholastic theology and his chief achievement in philosophy

was the ontological argument for the existence of God. His work Cur Deus homo? taught that atonement for sins could only be achieved through Christ. He was canonized in 1494 and named a Doctor of the Church in 1720.. ©LPi



REGISTRATION OPENS SOON!

The St. Margaret of York Catholic Church Parish Religion Program assists the parents (the primary catechists) in the faith formation of their children to know, love, and serve Jesus.

All parish children in grades 1-8 are expected to attend one of the following:

- Online PRP
- Sunday PRP, September April
- Family Faith
- Enrolled in the Parish School

Online PRP

When: Access to Course Content begins in June 2022

Our Online PRP is a flexible program is designed to equip parents to thrive in their natural vocation as the first Catechist and teacher of the faith to their children. The curriculum is Ignatius Press Life In Christ but instead of purchasing the physical books, Ignatius Press has partnered with Our Catholic Faith Delivered which allows for a complete, online approach to home study faith formation.

The students have access to their grade level materials online for a 1 year period and have the ability to complete the coursework at their own pace. All assessments and prayer exercises are completed through the online platform so that both the parents and our Faith Formation office can monitor progress in knowledge of the faith and relationship with Christ.

Sunday PRP

When: Sunday Mornings, September 2022 - April 2023

Sunday PRP uses the Graded Course of Study established by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, which encompasses the 7 tasks of catechesis: Prayer, Knowledge of the Faith, Liturgical Life, Moral Formation, Communal Life, Missionary Spirit, and Theology of the Body. Students will have the opportunity to talk about their faith with classmates their own age and with a devoted catechist. Children are required to have 2 years of religious education to receive a Sacrament. Preparation for Confirmation requires an additional component from our standard religious education programs during the Sacramental year. Any questions or concerns please contact Courtney Brown.

Family Faith

When: 3rd Sunday of Month, September 2022 - April 2023

Family Faith brings St. Margaret of York families together once a month to learn about the life of Jesus Christ, His teachings, our Catholic Faith, and helping families pass on a living faith. At home, parents will foster their relationship with Christ and help their children fall in love with Jesus as they journey toward Heaven as a family. On one Sunday of each month, families meet together to experience our Faith through teaching, discussion, and activities. The discussion and activities are broken up into age groups such as Parents (Adults), High School Age, Jr High Age, Middle School, Primary, and preschool, depending on the number of families who register.

Leave It in the Tomb

Today, on the most important day of the liturgical year, the Apostle Paul is calling us out.

"I see you hiding in that tomb," he says. "I see you baking with that old, stale yeast, thinking no one will notice."

He says it a little more elegantly, I'll grant you. But the message is this: If you want to be raised with Christ, you'd better be ready to step out of the shadows. Seek what is above — not what is on earth.

I can feel myself responding almost reflexively, "Great idea, Paul – but I'm pretty comfy here." Because sometimes, it's just easier to stay in the tomb. It's easier to crouch in the shadows and look outward at everyone else, thinking of the changes they could make or the sins they could overcome.

Today we are called to embrace newness. New hearts, new lives, new futures, new chances. If there's anything keeping you from that, you need to leave it in the tomb. It's a little scary, sure — maybe Jesus thought so before he stepped into the light of that first Easter morning. But no loaf of bread worth eating was ever baked using stale yeast that wouldn't rise. No new life worth having was ever lived through the broken sins of yesterday. No Easter morning ever dawned without the tomb sitting empty.






