Who Can Offer Anointing of the Sick?

Ouestion:

Can anyone offer the Anointing of the Sick to a sick or dying person, or is that only something a priest can do?

Answer:

The Letter of James speaks to us of the ancient tradition of a special anointing and blessing of those who are sick: "Is there anyone sick among you? Let him send for the presbyters of the Church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord ... If he has committed any sins, they will be forgiven him" (5:14, 15b). This passage forms the foundation for the theology of the sacrament that we call "Anointing of the Sick." In keeping with what we read in the Letter of James and the ancient tradition of the Church, the anointing of a person who is sick or dying may only be performed by a priest or bishop.

Although deacons and other members of the Church are not able to celebrate the sacrament with a person who is sick, we can read Sacred Scripture and pray with and for those who are ill. Resources like the Book of Blessings also contain special blessings that can be celebrated by deacons or lay ministers. In the end, we want to be sure that we show a special care and concern for the sick, helping them to always experience God's loving comfort made tangible through our acts of charity and service.

The World Is Watching

If you're a parent, you know this to be true: the world is watching. All it takes is one slip-up — one bad word, one selfish action, one uncharitable commentary, and that's the thing your child seems to notice.

When he or she calls you on it, the only thing you can do is come clean. "Yep, I did that," you have to say. "I'm a work in progress, but luckily, God never stops working."

I think it's fair to say that we don't think enough about the wounds of Christ. It's a little understandable, of course. Our human bodies flinch at the sight of such pain and mortification. It's a lot to handle, the physical trauma of a crucifixion. It carries an R rating in a PG world.

But the wounds of Christ are the only thing that could make Thomas believe. Literally nothing else was so powerful, not even the testimony of his most trusted friends. Only by looking at and feeling the torn flesh — by beholding that messy reality - did this Apostle, this actual companion of Christ, come to believe in the Resurrection.

"Christ has no body now but yours," goes the famous quote attributed to St. Teresa of Avila. What she's saying is that we have become the means through which God chooses to accomplish His will in the world. Us, the broken. Us, the weary. Us, the imperfect. Yes, miraculous events and apparitions still occur from time to time, but by and large, if a person is going to come to believe in Jesus Christ in this day and age, it will be because of something we Christians do or say.

Christ has no wounds now but ours. Our brokenness, our weariness, our imperfection — our reality. It all belongs to him, and the world is watching.



The St. Margaret of York Catholic Church Parish Religion Program assists the parents (the primary catechists) in the faith formation of their children to know, love, and serve Jesus.

Online PRP

When: Access to Course Content begins in June 2022

Our Online PRP is a flexible program designed to equip parents to thrive in their natural vocation as the first Catechist and teacher of the faith to their children. The curriculum is Ignatius Press Life In Christ but instead of purchasing the physical books, Ignatius Press has partnered with Our Catholic Faith Delivered which allows for a complete, online approach to home study faith formation.

The students have access to their grade level materials online for a 1 year period and have the ability to complete the coursework at their own pace. All assessments and prayer exercises are completed through the online platform so that both the parents and our Faith Formation office can monitor progress in knowledge of the faith and relationship with Christ.

Sunday PRP

When: Sunday Mornings, September 2022 - April 2023

Sunday PRP uses the Graded Course of Study established by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, which encompasses the 7 tasks of catechesis: Prayer, Knowledge of the Faith, Liturgical Life, Moral Formation, Communal Life, Missionary Spirit, and Theology of the Body. Students will have the opportunity to talk about their faith with classmates their own age and with a devoted catechist.

Family Faith

When: 3rd Sunday of Month, September 2022 - April 2023

Family Faith brings St. Margaret of York families together once a month to learn about the life of Jesus Christ, His teachings, our Catholic Faith, and helping families pass on a living faith. At home, parents will foster their relationship with Christ and help their children fall in love with Jesus as they journey toward Heaven as a family. On one Sunday of each month, families meet together to experience our Faith through teaching, discussion, and activities. The discussion and activities are broken up into age groups such as Parents (Adults), High School Age, Jr High Age, Middle School, Primary, and preschool, depending on the number of families who register.



St. Rose Venerini | May 7



The story of St. Rose of Venerini (February 9, 1656 – May 7, 1728) is one of having faith in God and his calling in your life. Born in Italy in 1656, she was the daughter of a doctor. Following the death of her fiancé, she entered a convent in the hopes of becoming a nun, but soon returned home to care for her mother after the death of her father. In an effort to keep up her spiritual side, St. Rose invited women of the neighborhood to recite the rosary in her home, and together they formed a sodality.

Unsure of where her life was headed, she sought the spiritual guidance of a Jesuit priest. After much contemplation, she admitted to feeling called to be a teacher in the world, rather than a nun in a convent. Eventually, she moved ahead and opened a free school for girls in 1685. Eventually, she was invited to oversee the training of teachers and the administration of schools in the Diocese of Montefiascone, which then led to being called upon to organize schools in many parts of Italy, including Rome.

St. Rose died in Rome in 1728 amid a number of miracles that many credit to her. The group of women she first prayed with in her home eventually became known as the Venerini Sisters, found in the United States and working among Italian immigrants. St. Rose was beatified in 1952 and canonized in 2006.

I am married to my wonderful husband, Dave. We are empty nesters, but we have two silly dogs and are the proud grandparents of 5, with number 6 due in July!


What do you like to do for fun?




