THE HOLY FAMILY

Theme: Family Life We are witnessing a breakdown of the traditional family and its values – filial respect for authority, exercised responsibility by parents – and a rising juvenile delinquency. Hence, our society can learn a few things from today's Bible readings. Of course, there is no easy remedy available for today's family crisis. Also, the Christian family is part of a culture in which human beings participate – neighborhood, school, television, friends and recreation patterns. But in stormy weather a ship may get at least some guidance from a beacon. And though authority from the earliest infancy should be exercised perhaps in a different way, it should not be completely eliminated. Parents could discuss this with their children. A substitute for sound family life has not yet been offered by any of the behavioral sciences.

Today's readings on the family necessarily reflect the patriarchal family pattern, hence the subordinationist family ethic, of the Biblical culture. We should distinguish between the core of the Christian ethic and the cloth in which it is wrapped. This cloth is conditioned by time and culture and is not necessarily part of the divine message. But the message on family life as such is timeless.


