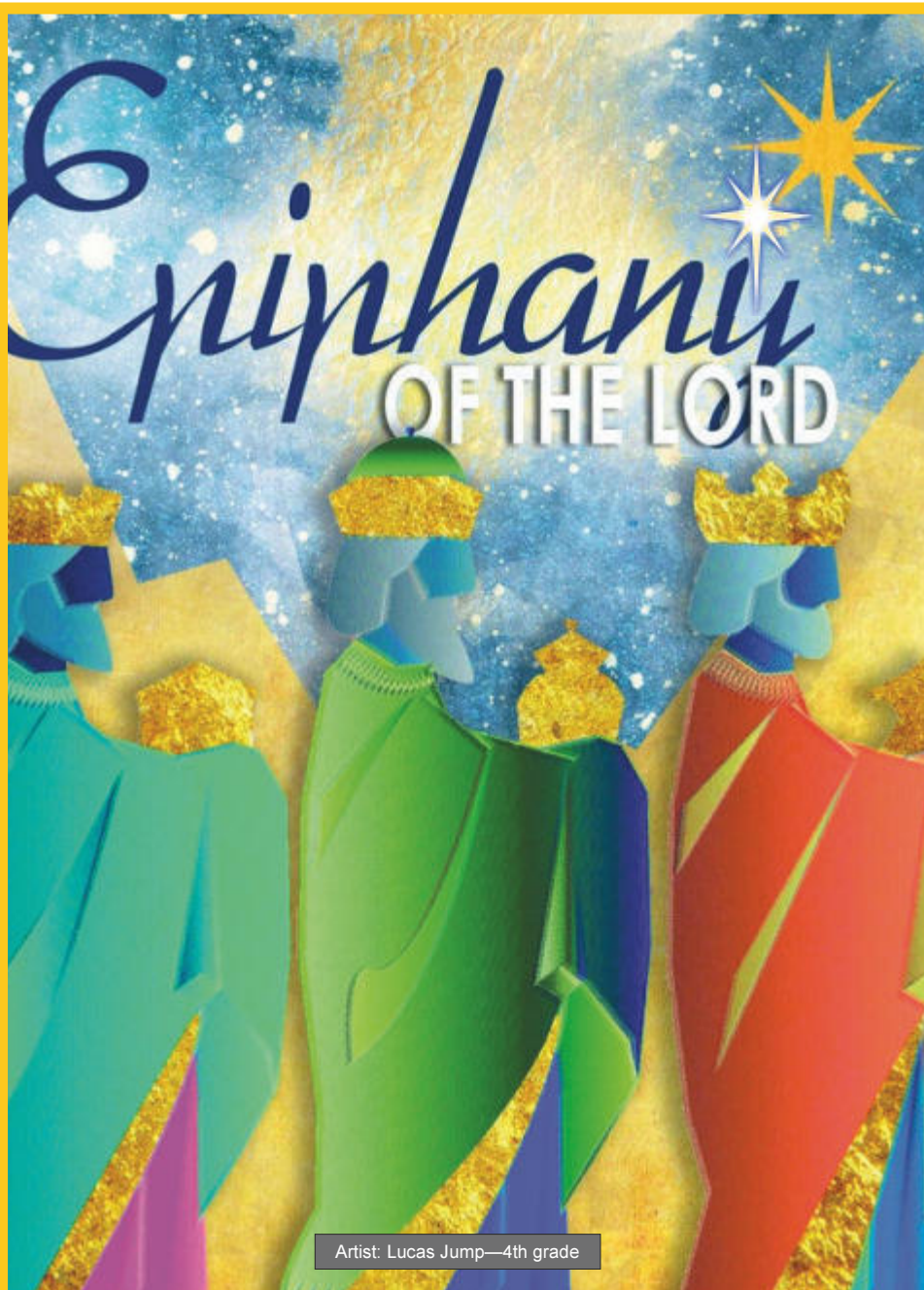

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Theme: Jesus' Royal Messiahship of Both Jews and Gentiles
Often people travel and pay \$25.00 or \$100.00 a plate to attend a dinner party where a famous politician makes an appearance. Today we celebrate the appearance of the Lord Jesus on the human scene. For the Greeks, the word "Epiphany" was used to describe the appearance or manifestation of a god among human beings. The Greek Fathers used it for their Incarnation of the Son of God.

As the feast is celebrated now in the Western Church, it brings out a prominent aspect of the Christmas Mystery, namely, the manifestation (Epiphany) of the universal dominion of the newborn King, as dramatized in the Lord Jesus' manifestation to the Magi (wise men from the East).

Again the symbolism of light is lavishly used. "This day Christ appeared to the world as a light shining in the darkness. May you follow Him in faith and be a light to others" (Solemn Blessing).

2023 SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: 2023 SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: "We're listening!" Synodality is "journeying together" - a way of living out our faith that involves shared responsibility, listening and speaking to one another, and discernment with the Holy Spirit to address the issues facing our Church today. The diocesan consultation about how we journey together is underway, and we want to hear from **everyone** - as many people as possible, especially those who are often excluded or who are not involved in the life of the Church. There are two main ways to participate. Listening sessions will be held in a variety of formats during the months of January, February and March as determined by parishes, institutions and organizations. And for those unable to join in a listening session, an online survey is available at covidio.org/synod. Continue to look for more information in parish communications, on social media, or on the diocesan website covidio.org/synod.

GRIEFSHARE—This is a new 13 week program starting at St. Barbara on Sunday, February 6, 2022 at 6:30 PM. After the funeral, when the cards and flowers have stopped coming, most of the people around you return to their normal lives. But your grief continues and you feel alone. We will walk with you on the long path through grief toward healing and hope from your grief. Each session is "self-contained," so you do not have to attend in sequence. Each session will cover the stages of grief and provide assistance and guidance how to get through each stage. Anyone interested in participating should contact Penny in the church office.

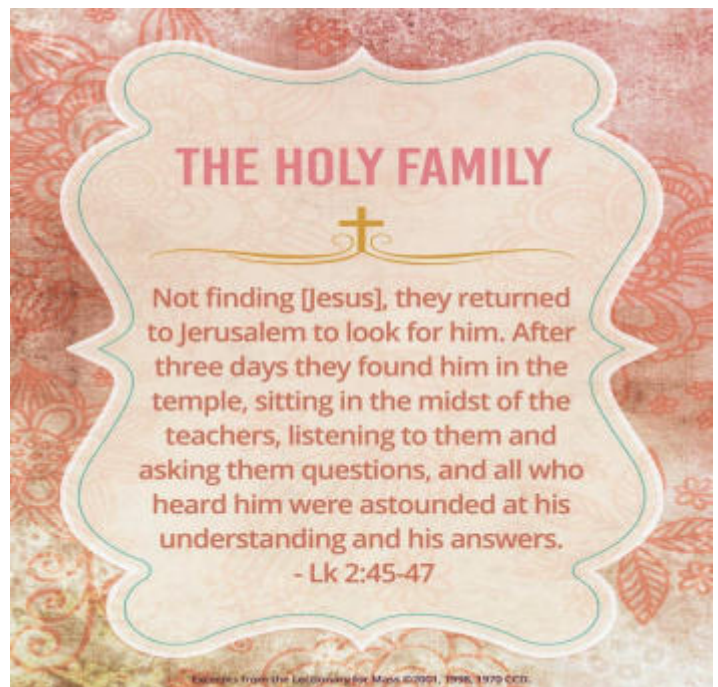
