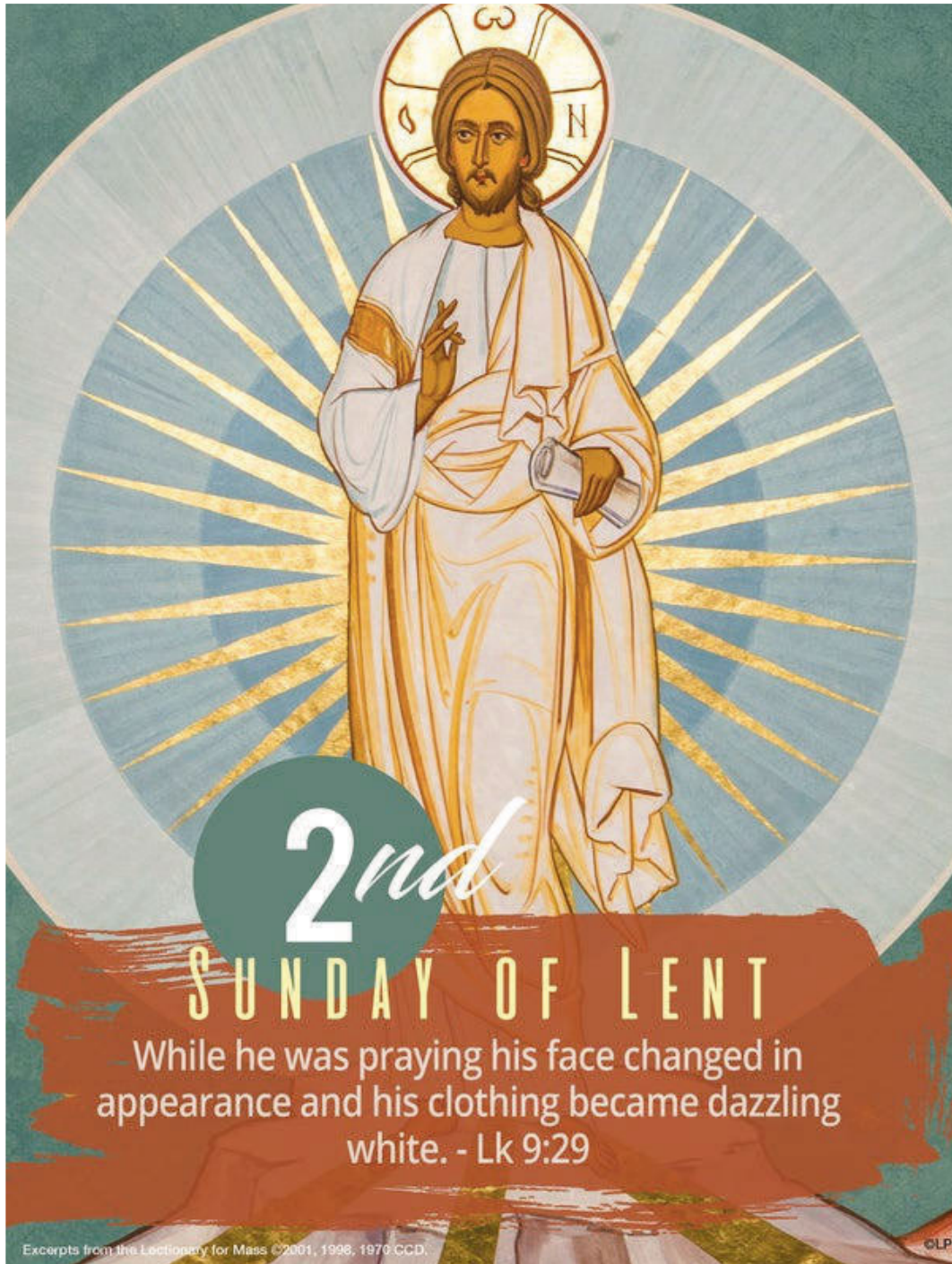

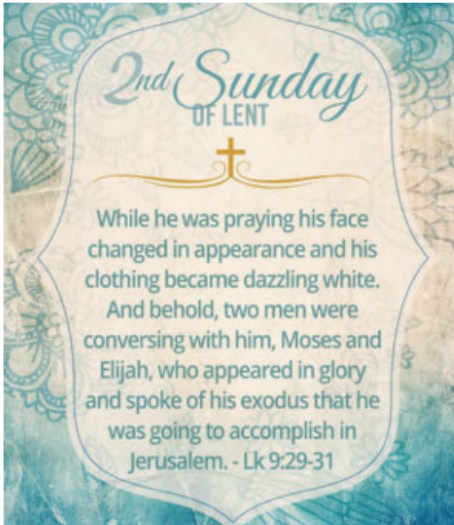

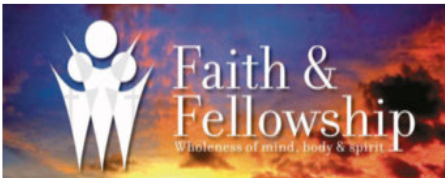

2ND SUNDAY OF LENT

Theme: In Prayer, Lift Up Your Hearts to God We all know the classic story of the dedicated family man who exclaims to his wife: "Honey, please do not ask me anymore whether I love you. I told you so when we got married ten years ago. I provide for the family and pay all the bills, including the notes on the new refrigerator and the mink I gave you for Christmas . . ." all this shows that he loves her. Is that not enough? The fact is that it is not! His wife wants to hear that he loves her over and over again, and he needs to say it. If this is not done, these two people will drift apart and jeopardize their marriage.

Your relationship with God is that of a sacred partnership (covenant) which has clearly martial overtones. Of course, no comparison is adequate. God does not feel unhappy when you do not encounter him directly in prayer or fail to say that you love him and appreciate what he is doing for you. But you need to do so! And if you do not, you will drift away from him, regardless of your charity to others.

Today's Scripture readings deal with persons conversing with God. Their examples may inspire us. Have a look at yourself during Lent: "Do I find prayer important? How often and when do I pray? Does my daily Bible reading result in meditative prayer to God?"

LENT—FASTING & ABSTINENCE Requires a Catholic from 18 to 59 to reduce the amount of food eaten from normal. The Church defines this as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Such fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Abstinence requires a Catholic 14 years of age until death to abstain from eating meat on Fridays in honor of the passion of Jesus. On Fridays outside of Lent, Catholics in the U.S. may substitute a penitential or even a charitable practice of their own choosing.

Marriage - Preparations should begin with the Pastor or Deacons at least six months in advance. Must be a member of the parish six months before setting wedding date.

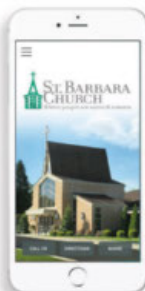
