Musings from Fr. Dave, 4th Sunday Ordinary Time - January 30, 2022

The prophets of the Old Testament and Jesus often told people what they did not want to hear. Call it tough love, or a hard look at reality, they were hard things to say to people. Think of your own life. How did you, or how do you react when someone tells you something that you did not want to hear. I bet you needed to hear it. Advice on living, health, love, forgiveness, and reconciliation, just to name a few.

We have all experienced this. It is part of "The Dance of Life." I have come across this many times in my life: growing up in my family of origin and trying to honor my parents, my continuing spiritual, human and Christian growth with the Franciscans, and in deep conversations with close friends.


