

#### St. Peter Claver

On Sept. 9, the Catholic Church celebrates St. Peter Claver, a Jesuit missionary who spent his life in the service of African slaves brought against their will to South America during the 17th century. Peter Claver was born into a farming family in the Spanish region of Catalonia

during 1581. He studied at the University of Barcelona as a young man, and joined the Jesuits as a novice at the age of 20. Peter was determined to sacrifice his own freedom to bring material aid and eternal salvation to the African slaves, in keeping with his vow to become "the slave of the blacks forever." The young priest made and kept this resolution despite his own health problems (aggravated by Cartagena's tropical climate) and the language barrier between himself and the population he served. In keeping with his vow of "slavery," Peter survived on minimal amounts of food and sleep. His life of humility and penance led to miraculous occurrences – as when he healed the sick with the touch of his cloak, or appeared surrounded by a supernatural light during his hospital visits. St. Peter Claver's work came to an end with his death on September 8, 1654. He had baptized and taught the faith to more than 300,000 slaves during his four decades in Cartagena.

# III A JUST MAN A HUSBAND

20. In the Liturgy, Mary is celebrated as "united to Joseph, the just man, by a bond of marital and virginal love."(31) There are really two kinds of love here, both of which together represent the mystery of the Church - virgin and spouse - as symbolized in the marriage of Mary and Joseph. "Virginity or celibacy for the sake of the Kingdom of God not only does not contradict the dignity of marriage but presupposes and confirms it. Marriage and virginity are two ways of expressing and living the one mystery of the Covenant of God with his people."(32) the Covenant which is a communion of love between God and human beings.

Through his complete self-sacrifice, Joseph expressed his generous love for the Mother of God, and gave her a husband's "gift of self." Even though he decided to draw back so as not to interfere in the plan of God which was coming to pass in Mary, Joseph obeyed the explicit command of the angel and look Mary into his home, while respecting the fact that she belonged exclusively to God.

On the other hand, it was from his marriage to Mary that Joseph derived his singular dignity and his rights in regard to Jesus. "It is certain that the dignity of the Mother of God is so exalted that nothing could be more sublime; yet because Mary was united to Joseph by the bond of marriage, there can be no doubt but that Joseph approached as no other person ever could that eminent dignity whereby the Mother of God towers above all creatures. Since marriage is the highest degree of association and friendship involving by its very nature a communion of goods, it follows that God, by giving Joseph to the Virgin, did not give him to her only as a companion for life, a witness of her virginity and protector of her honor: he also gave Joseph to Mary in order that he might share, through the marriage pact, in her own sublime greatness."(33)




# San Pedro Claver (9 de Septiembre)

Nació en Verdú, España, el 26 de junio de 1580. Pedro Claver y Juana Corberó, campesinos catalanes, tuvieron seis hijos, pero solo sobrevivieron Juan, el mayor, y

los dos más pequeños, Pedro e Isabel. Pedro se graduó de la Universidad de Barcelona. A los 19 años decide ser Jesuita e ingresa en Tarragona. Mientras estudiaba filosofía en Mallorca en 1605 se encuentra con San Alonso Rodriguez, portero del colegio. Fue providencial. San Alonso recibió por inspiración de Dios conocimiento de la futura misión del joven Pedro y desde entonces no paró de animarlo a ir a evangelizar lo territorios españoles en América.Pedro creyó en esta inspiración y con gran fe y el beneplácito de sus superiores se embarcó hacia la Nueva Granada en 1610. Debía estudiar su teología en Santa Fe de Bogotá. Allí estuvo dos años, uno en Tunja y luego es enviado a Cartagena, en lo que hoy es la costa de Colombia. En Cartagena es ordenado sacerdote el 20 de marzo de 1616.
