FIRST READING—Genesis 9:8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: “See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark. I will establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the waters of a flood; there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth.” God added: “This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you: I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings.”

RESPONSORIAL—Psalm 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9

Response: Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant.

SECOND READING—1 Peter 3:18-22

Beloved:

Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

GOSPEL— Mark 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: “This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel.”

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

LENT

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JAY



Our “Corona Time” Lent is like spiritual auto repair shop where the Lord calls us to a conversion of heart. Crucial to the conversion is that the Lord wants to do his divine work in the engine of our humanity—the heart. The heart is the throne of where we make decisions. It is the confluence of our deep emotions and personal reflections. In some sense, the heart is the motor of our human nature.

Lent becomes a time for our Divine Mechanic to clean the salt from the exterior of the car, to get an oil change and a tune-up for the engine. We need spiritual jumper cables if we let our hearts steep in the cold culture we live in.

So let us ask ourselves, “What does God want to be in me? What does he want to fix in my heart so that my life is healthier, happier and holier?” Our Lenten practices are ways of changing out vices for virtues by taking our hearts to our Divine Mechanic. The Lord wants us to arrive to Easter Sunday this year with hearts running at the pace of Christ’s Sacred Heart.

Jesus teaches this through our Church:

“Jesus’ call to conversion and penance, like that of the prophets before him, does not aim first at outward works, ‘sackcloth and ashes,’ fasting and mortification, but at the conversion of the heart, interior conversion. Without this, such penances remain sterile and false; however, interior conversion urges expression in visible signs, gestures and works of penance.”(CCC 1430)

Let’s pray for each other and ourselves to commit to Lenten practices that best allow the Lord to change our hearts from ungodly ways.

Sure, we all know what not to do for Lent: Don't eat candy, don't eat too much, don't eat meat on Fridays, don't swear, don't miss Mass ...

This year, unlike any other, on Ash Wednesday, ashes were not imposed on our forehead so that others may see. Instead, they were sprinkled on the crown of our head, invisible (mostly) to the naked eye.

This is not unlike what it says in *Matthew 6:6*... "But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you."

But what are you doing?

Are we doing random acts of kindness, are we praying more, are we spending time in Eucharistic Adoration, are we giving of our time and talent, are we making the most of this Lent? And are we doing so in ways that are totally selfless?

Indeed, I would suggest that we take time to find ways to do more with an attitude of self-sacrifice. Allow that person with three items to go before you in the grocery line; let the car in such a hurry pass you by and say a prayer for their safety; find a spot in your home to take time in quiet meditation; say a kind word to a stranger; clean your closets of unneeded items and give them to the poor.

You may be surprised at how "clean" your soul will feel and how much our Father will repay you as He sees in secret what you do with a willing spirit.
