During January 2019 we provided food and utilities assistance each Tuesday and Thursday for ten(10) service days for a total of 384 households and 802 individuals. Distribution included seventy (70) Seniors at Gilhaven Manor. Utilities assistance was provided to 48 people, for a total of \$1,576.26. A total of 13,575 lbs of food was picked up from partner stores and received from in-kind donations. Your weekly donations of dry goods (mac & cheese, peanut butter, CEREAL, pasta, canned goods, etc) continues to be a major source. No glass jars please. Clean plastic and especially brown paper shopping bags are also needed

Some of the items purchased came from funds raised last Christmas when we added ornaments to the Jesse Tree in the Commons. Other funds came in through recent donations. Current purchases have been made with an eye to being able to completely outfit the hall in the future, while acknowledging the possibility of accidents/need for replacement with reasonably-priced items.

Recent additions include table cloths, colored napkins, dinner plates, salad bowls, soup bowls and glasses along with enough flatware to serve 108, and silverware holders for storage and dishwashing. The Knights of Columbus donated a three burner Bunn Coffee Pot recently to replace our old one that had faulty wiring (it happened to reveal an issue in the wiring in the hall...St. Joseph looking out for us again). Current needs for the hall/complex: 84 coffee cups (\$400), Wire shelving for storage (\$400), 8-channel video recorder and wiring for security cameras that were donated recently (\$300). Many thanks for your generous contributions helping to make life a little better and easier in our parish community.

Reporting Child Sexual Abuse and Sexual Harassment

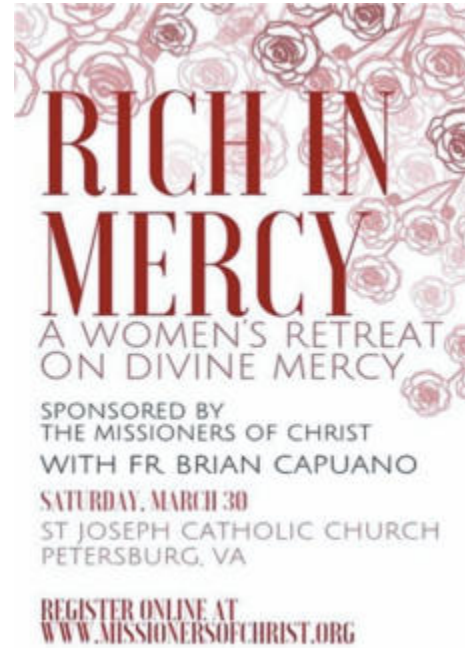
