Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

Hope Center Update:

During February 2019 we provided food and utilities assistance each Tuesday and Thursday for eight (8) service days for a total of 327 households and 858 individuals. This was a record month for distributing food. Utilities assistance was provided to 38 people, for a total of \$1,646. A total of 15,310 lbs of food was picked up from partner stores and received from in-kind donations. Your weekly donations of dry goods (mac & cheese, peanut butter, jelly, CEREAL, pasta, sauce, canned veggies, etc) continues to be a major source. No glass jars please. Clean brown paper shopping bags are also needed. We are still in need of volunteers who will pick up from our partner stores at Food Lion and ALDI once a month. Brown Bag Outreach

Ever wonder what is in the brown bag? Well, there **is food for the body**, of course, . . . a peanut butter and jelly sandwich, a bag of chips (lays potato chips because they are easier to eat for people who don't have good teeth), "Nabs" Cheese and crackers, a package of Cookies, a Banana, a soda, a Mint, and a Napkin because, we must be neat! J And then we add **some food for the soul** . . . a copy of Sunday's Gospel and a prayer for the week.

Thank you for your prayers and support for the Brown Bag Outreach. I would like to share with you some of the stories from our experiences.

This past Christmas (2018), a well dress middle-aged woman came in to the Commons area at church and approached one of our ushers to thank the church for "taking in" her father, a homeless vet, by welcoming him, giving him bag lunches, and treating him kindly.

Another homeless lady will often leave a few coins in front of Mary on the Legion of Mary Table. One day she handed me thirty-six cents because she wanted to pay something, even though I told her it was free. I thought of the story of the widow who put in a very little, and I thanked her, and put the money in an envelope for the Brown Bag Outreach Donation.

We also invite people to come to Mass and learn about God. One young man in particular was very interested and often comes to Mass. He sits in the back and one of the ushers, sits with him and explains what is happening. He has been taught to cross his chest with his arms to get a blessing during communion. He looks forward to getting his blessing.

I have noticed that some of the people who come for the lunches also have an unusual odor. On at least one occasion, a homeless man decided to go in to Mass and this person had a strong odor. This person sat next to one of our regular parishioners. She must have noticed the odor, but she chose to ignore it, and she shared her missal with the homeless man, showing him where we were in the Mass, so he could follow along.

We have recently changed the time for handing out the bagged meals from before and during the 8:30 Sunday morning Mass to **between the two Sunday Masses**. We hand out the meals from 9:45 to 10:15AM.

Thank you for your support, your prayers and your patience. If you have any suggestions or questions, please feel to pass those along to me. We want to make St. Joseph's a most welcoming and loving Catholic church.

Living our Mission Campaign Funds

As you know we are slowly coming to the end of our 5-year Living Our Mission Capital Campaign that provided the means for an extraordinary opportunity for financial generosity on the part of the faithful throughout the diocese. Our goal was a stretch: \$702,000. We exceeded that goal to receive in pledges just short of \$1.2 million. To date we have received these pledges through regular installments of one-time gifts, monthly, quarterly and yearly contributions into the campaign accounts to allow the parish to receive quarterly checks. These checks have been deposited into the various areas of parish life that were previously designated: St. Joseph School Endowments and Building Campaign, the parish building fund and the hall rebuilding project.

To date we have collected \$927,707. This includes the recent check sent to the parish at the beginning of the month totally: \$16,062.98. We have an outstanding balance of \$153,068.02 left to collect.

First, thank you to all who have been able to sacrificially give to the campaign. We have seen very positive growth in the last few years. Second, thank you to those who are continuing to give to the campaign, the operating fund and other projects around the parish - it is worth the sacrifice.

The continued gifts according to our pledges to the end of the campaign will enable us to pay off the hall debt within the next year.

For those unable to maintain the Living Our Mission campaign pledge, please consider reaching out to me via email or contacting the campaign organizers at the diocese to let us know of your situation. It will help us plan how to manage the debt incurred on the decision to rebuild the hall. - Fr. Capuano
