DO YOU HAVE AN ADVENT

WREATH? As a child, I remember my family gathered every evening of Advent around our Advent wreath, which was the centerpiece of our dinner table, while we

sang "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" inviting Jesus, the Light of the world, into our lives.

It's easy to buy an Advent wreath, and fun to make one. It's also a beautiful tradition full of symbolism that reminds us to prepare our hearts through penance, prayer, song and joy to welcome Jesus more fully this Christmas.

The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday. Three of the candles are purple because the color violet is a liturgical color that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The pink candle is supposed to remind us of the sky's color just before dawn, and we light it on the third Sunday of Advent to remind us Christ is near!

BLESSED **SACRAMENT HOLY HOUR**

The Supreme court will hear oral arguments until a decision is handed down. With abortion taking the lives of over 600,000 babies a year in the United States, this Supreme Court case Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Health Organization is the greatest opportunity in a generation to create change and overturn Roe vs. Wade. With their decision, the U.S. Supreme Court could affirm that life is a human right and uphold Mississippi's Law.

1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT



From the Pastor-Fr. Damian Hils

Dear Family,

The first Sunday of Advent is the beginning of a new year for a follower of Jesus Christ. I pray that this coming year will be a better one than the last. Let us all pray that in the coming twelve months, we will grow in love and mercy.

Since we are starting a new year, I thought I might offer some reflections about my first year and a half here.

We have all lived through this miasma of uncertainty and suffering because of a virus popularly called Covid. Some people suffered greatly during this time. I am thinking of those who died because they could not breathe anymore. I am thinking of the elderly in nursing homes who were quarantined without their consent. I am thinking of children who were not allowed to see their parents in such facilities. It has been an awful time for so many. The inconvenience of wearing a mask is nothing in comparison - whether they work or not.

I am writing today about the state of our parish in this new Covid reality we find ourselves in.

Let's start with attendance at Mass. Here are the statistics:

Mass attendance: in 2019: 4006 in 2020: 1714 in 2021: 2552

Basically we are down a little more than a third in Sunday attendance or 37% to be more exact.

With a decrease in attendance there has also been a decrease in offertory. We are down about 8% in the Sunday Collection.

The school is also off in enrollment. We slipped below 500 students last year. This decline is part of a ten year trend. A decade ago our enrollment was at 618 students.

Last year we offered 47 funerals here. We mourn the loss of these parishioners. In days past, they helped to hold the parish together.

All of these stats speak of decline. I refuse to go along with this narrative of declination for Blessed Sacrament. I am going to rebuild. Please join me in this effort.

Currently, I am looking at establishing a pre-school and building a second gymnasium. Schools are judged these days in the public forum not just on academics, but also in terms of facilities. It's time. I will give you more details when I have them. I will be meeting with the Diocesan Building Commission on tomorrow to discuss these matters, and I will keep you posted as to the results.

In the meantime, I need your help to reestablish our parish for the next 100 years.

First of all, if you can afford to increase your Sunday contribution, I would be grateful.

Secondly, we need help with volunteers for the Masses we offer here.

1. Please consider being a sacristy helper. This means coming early before Mass and setting up and taking down. And there are little things as well, like polishing the brass caps on top of the candles, some light ironing, washing the servers white albs, and dusting.

2. Servers. We need more altar boys and girls to step up and serve the Mass. This is an act of charity for the community. It is also a chance to experience the Mass in a profound and intimate way. Personally, speaking as a priest, I learned how to say Mass as a boy when I served here for Msgr. Grosser, Fr. Broering, and Fr. DeLange.

3. We need more lectors. It is a privilege to read the Bible before others because the words we use are not our own. The words used have been given to us by the Holy Spirit.

4. Greeters and ushers. This is a beautiful ministry to extend to everyone who crosses the threshold of the church the love of God for them. It is a great comfort to people who, upon arriving, are given a witness of Christ's love by your ministry.

Anyway, this is a lot for a first of the year letter. Next week, I will tell you about the meeting which I have tomorrow.
