





Saint of the Week

A name that means "light," St. Lucy (283 – 304) is the patron saint of those blind or suffering with eye trouble. Not much is known about her life, except that she was determined to remain a virgin and thus refused marriage. History tells the story of a frustrated suitor who eventually accused St. Lucy of being a Christian (at crime at the time), and she was executed in Syracuse, Sicily, in the year 304.

Today, we celebrate a number of traditions that incorporate symbolic meaning of St. Lucy as the "bearer" of light in the darkness of winter. This is particularly seen in Scandinavian countries, with their long dark winters. There, a young girl dressed in a white dress and a red sash (as the symbol of martyrdom) carries palms and wears a crown or wreath of candles on her head. In Denmark, Norway and Sweden, girls dressed as Lucy carry rolls and cookies in procession as songs are sung.

From the Pastor-Fr. Damian Hils

Dear Family,

Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I say rejoice! Today is Gaudete Sunday. The violet color associated with penance is mixed with the white of joy to create the rose colored vestments.

We welcome to our altar Fr. Conor Kunath who serves as the vocations coordinator for the Diocese of Covington.

I know there is a custom of giving to our parish at Christmas time. I thought I would point out some aesthetical upgrades we have made in the past year.

Personally, I donated a statue of the Sacred Heart, candlesticks for the side altars, an altar cross, two candelabrae, three chalices, one ciborium, and some altar lace. People gave me these things over the years for safe keeping, and I am glad they have found a home here.

I upgraded our Baptismal font. We had been using a large plastic bowl, and I thought we could do better. It cost \$7,500.00.

One day, Hank Barczak showed me two kneelers in a closet over at the school. They date back to 1938. I asked the people who made the font to make some copies of the two original ones. They cost \$3,000.00 each.

The Pascal candle stand. Our sacristan told me it had not been cleaned or polished in 9 years, and I am sure she was right. So that was refurbished, polished, and lacquered. It will not tarnish for a long, long time. This cost \$1,100.00. A brand new one of similar size would cost \$3,000.00 to \$4,000.00.

The original bronze sanctuary lamp. I found it in a closet when I arrived and sent it away to be refinished and lacquered. That cost \$575.00.

When I arrived, Bishop Foys came to our parish three times in ten weeks. He was insistent that we have seven candlesticks on the altar just as they do at the cathedral. They cost \$190.00 each

I bought some linen altar cloths with embroidery because the cloths which we used to have for the altars are gone. I searched all over, and cannot find them. So one of the cloths was \$277.00, two of them were \$322.75.

I have already received \$9,000.00 in donations toward these things. If you would like to contribute toward these things please let me know

St. Vincent De Paul Society 2020-2021 Annual Report to Blessed Sacrament Parish

The Blessed Sacrament Parish Conference of St. Vincent De Paul Society fiscal year ended on September 30, 2021. Our Conference has been reaching out to those in need within and surrounding our parish since 1923. During all of these 98 years Blessed Sacrament Church and its parish family have supported this ministry of charity through generous donations, including a monthly Parish Outreach stipend, offertory collections on Thanksgiving Day and Holy Thursday, and weekly/monthly gifts via Faith Direct. Your financial support provides much of our budgeted income and we could not perform our ministry without the aid of such generous parishioners. Our SVDP Conference continues to thrive thanks to the many hours of dedicated service of our Vincentians. We have welcomed new members this year and hope to continue growing as that allows us to reach out in new ways to those we serve. We will be having an Invitation to Serve in the first half of 2022 in an effort to increase our membership.

While we ended the year with a small deficit, the growth of our receipts is largely due to the generosity of our parish family and the assistance of SVDP Regional Council. Receipts grew from \$38,527.70 in 2019 to \$80,661.55 this year. This increase in receipts allowed us to continue to serve those in need growing our ability to impact our neighbors from \$38,969.62 in 2019 to \$81,231.88 this year. The difficulties brought on by the Covid pandemic have placed many families in a position of need where they have never found themselves before. We could have not done this work without your generous support.

During this past year we were blessed to be able to assist over 1235 people making more than 473 home or telephone visits. Telephone visits have largely been used to keep our Vincentians and our neighbors in need safe since the outbreak of Covid 19. Our dedicated Vincentian volunteers drove over 2135 miles and gave 1130 hours of their time to serve those in need right here in our neighborhood. In addition to the direct rent and utility assistance provided, Vincentians also distributed over 200 bags of food, 97 furniture / household item vouchers and 167 clothing vouchers. All of these vouchers were redeemable at the St. Vincent DePaul stores in Erlanger, Cold Spring and Florence. The estimated value of the food and vouchers is \$28,870. Our Birthday Party Committee has once again begun to provide a special touch on the birthday of special people, visiting with approximately 19 children living at St. Joseph Apartments as well as 6 retired priests in care facilities and 16 retired sisters at St. Walburg Monastery.

The pandemic created an increased need for food and clothing vouchers plus a greatly increased need for rent and utilities assistance. Through the generosity of our Vincentians, parish, parishioners and help from SVDP Council and other SVDP Conferences we have maintained a level of service to those most in need that many other organizations could not achieve. Thank you again for your continuing support!






2023 SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: "FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH; COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION, MIS-
