Dear friends in Christ, every year different groups pick their person of the year for contributions in different ways to the society. If however one

were to pick the greatest person that ever lived, it won't be difficult for most people to choose Jesus. In Luke's gospel (7:24-30), however, Jesus referred to John as the greatest of all men born of women but with a qualification, "the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than John." It is only in this affirmation, we can truly understand how important it is to belong to Christ.

Jesus spoke to the crowds concerning John, after the disciples had left. "What did you go out into the wilderness to behold?" This is a question we will also have to reflect on. "A reed shaken by the wind?" Obviously not. "To see a man dressed in soft raiment?" The wilderness is not the place to look for that; that is better seen at the palaces, parties and during feast days. "To see a prophet? Yes, more than a prophet." The prophetic image and word of John brought the crowd to him, not only to listen, but also to be baptized, a sign of their repentance. Many people however, missed the real point of their visit to the wilderness, they went for a "show" and not the message. Jesus said to them,

"Among those born of women, none is greater than John, yet, he who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he." To see those who have no faith and are swept right, left and centre, running from one church to the other for solutions? This is not the best place to do that. What have you come for? To hear the prophetic message? Yes! that is what the Church exists to provide. Where do you belong? Search deep within yourself. Are you one of those who choose and pick what to believe? Those who follow the Lord in as much as they are not inconvenienced? Are you in church for showmanship? To see the priest or choir perform? There's time for concert. But do you blame followers only; what of leaders who have turned religious events into showbiz? If a church event is about how many people attended and not the true message of the gospel that can turn their lives around, then, there is a big problem.
