## Featured Ministry

ALTAR SERVER



Servers carry the incense and thurible and present the bread and wine along with the water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts or assist him when he receives the gifts from the people. Servers wash the hands of the priest, and assist the priest and deacon as necessary.

Serving at the altar is a unique and privileged ministry unlike any other available to lay persons. Servers are involved in all parts of each liturgical celebration, and they kneel in closer proximity to the altar during the miracle of transubstantiation than anyone else other than the priest or deacon.

Server ministry is open to children in grade four or above. Servers may not opt out of serving weekday or early masses. They will be rotated through all mass times. However, servers who are not students at BSS are not scheduled during school time. The schedule is posted online, and servers may try to switch with each other when necessary. Quarterly, they are given the opportunity to block out family vacation time or other family dates. *Contact: Kathy Woltermann in the Parish Office*.
