#### DID YOU KNOW?

The Nicene Creed that we recite together at mass was first articulated in 325 A.D. at the first ecumenical Council of Nicaea in response to heresy concerning the divinity of Jesus. Notice how much of the Creed addresses who Jesus is: "True God from true God," "begotten, not made," "consubstantial with the Father."

This will be a great opportunity for our children to get to know the new Bishop, especially because he will probably be the one to offer them the sacrament of Confirmation in the years to come.

Today's first reading is from the Book of Nehemiah. He was a prophet who was assigned by the Persians to come and rebuild Jerusalem. The Jewish people had been living in exile for 70 years, and at last they were able to return. The emperor even gave them money for the project. So Nehemiah came and built the walls first, and then the temple. (These walls would later be reconfigured and rebuilt during the reign of Herod the Great).

Ezra was the priest who preached beautifully to the people reminding them of God's merciful love. They are weeping because even though grave infidelity had entered their community 70 years before, and the subsequent loss of their nation, they at last have found themselves home. In other words, God offered them a second chance. And don't we all need second chances after we have made mistakes.

Did someone stop to let you pull into their lane? Did someone bring your lost earing to the Lost & Found? Did the person in front of you at the drive-through pay for your lunch?

Sometimes all it takes to brighten "one of those days" is for someone to let you go ahead of them in the grocery line or hand you a coupon they don't plan to use.

Even those whose names are known are not always remembered. Do you know Prochorus (Acts 6:5), Trophimus (Acts 20:4), Mnason (Acts 21:16)? Have you heard of Saint Paul of Tarsus? Why, of course; he wrote all those letters in the bible; he was the apostle to the Gentiles. Everyone knows Paul, but not everyone can name the many others who helped spread the Gospel, like those named above. How many unnamed disciples helped bring us the faith we live today? Does lack of recognition negate their contributions? Of course not?

Each of us has daily opportunities to be good stewards in little, often unseen ways. Being an unknown benefactor to someone else can change the world, rippling through time in ways we may never know. It can also change us. We don't always know whom we are helping. As *Hebrews 13:2* reminds us: "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares."


