FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Family,

The first reading today is quite dramatic. Saul, the first king of Israel became envious of David, his greatest warrior. So he set out to kill David out of envy. In this history of the two, we see some of the seven deadly sins on display. There is pride and envy. Eventually with David, there will also be lust.

The good thing in our reading today is that David rises above the occasion he has to kill Saul. The opportunity for anger, another of the seven deadly sins, is declined. He does not kill his adversary even though Saul has treated him so unjustly.

Our own lives will probably not involve the drama of dynastic struggles. None of us are in line to become a king or queen. But within our circle of human relationships there can arise moments when we are tempted to anger or revenge. David left the cave as a merciful man. So in our relationships, must we be merciful even when our feelings are hurt and the injustices are real.

REFLECTION

STEWARDSHIP AND HUMBLE AWARENESS

When we think of stewardship, the words "time, talent, and treasure" frequently come to mind. These certainly are blessings that God entrusts to our care. Stewardship, however, is a complete way of thinking and living. Sometimes the best stewardship is recognizing what is not ours to steward.

In this Sunday's first reading, David has an opportunity to kill King Saul, who, with an army at his command, has been hunting David and trying to kill him out of jealousy. David stewards this moment by taking Saul's spear as the king sleeps. Saul awakens to the knowledge that his life was in David's hands in the night, and David did not take it. David recognized Saul as the king whom God had anointed, and he did not usurp God's power over the king's life.

Jesus, in the Gospel, tells us to love our enemies and do good to those who persecute us. Like David, we may have opportunities to hurt those who have hurt us, but our LORD has not granted us stewardship over vengeance. We who are sinners dare not sit in judgment over other sinners.

Good stewardship requires humble awareness of our place in God's plan. We are here to do our Lord's will. May God help us discern how to steward what he entrusts to us and to trust him with what is his alone.

R.C.I.A.: This Sunday we hear some of the most difficult teachings of our Lord, Jesus Christ. But first, let us reflect a bit about our faith. At the very basis of our faith is a belief in God. Today more and more people don't believe in God at all. Even many people who would call themselves Catholics say that they do not believe in a God. That is difficult to imagine, perhaps, but it is documented in at least one opinion poll. Let us assume for a moment that all of us reading this believe in God. We who believe in God also believe that God created the heavens and the earth and all that is in them. We have our own distinctive creation stories in our Bible, the Holy Scriptures. We believe that God has sent His Son, Jesus Christ, fully human and fully divine, to be our Savior. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.

This short statement of what we believe, our Creed, is really important today. We want to continue to understand more profoundly what we believe. Only in the context of this belief do the teachings of Jesus make sense. You might like to come to our RCIA sessions to understand your faith better.
