FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Family,

In the first reading today, we find the following: "Look up at the sky, and count the stars if you can ..." I don't know if you have ever had the experience of going to a remote place on the planet. I did not find such a place until I went to Montana and Wyoming in the summer of 1994. There, I found a patch of planet earth far away from all cities. At night, I saw what Abraham saw. Who created all of this, I thought? I have never understood atheists. Looking at that perfectly blue, midnight sky with the moon and the stars above, I had more than enough visual confirmation for the premise that God exists as the author of all creation. And if he created such a magnificent display, then surely He created you and me, and a plan for our lives.

In the gospel today, Saint Peter experiences an even more profound experience of divinity. He sees Our Blessed Lord in His glory. This moment is called the Transfiguration of the Lord. Jesus gives Peter and James and John this glimpse into His divinity because in a short amount of time after this scene, they will see Him arrested, mocked, beaten, crowned with thorns, and crucified. He ended up looking very much like a failure who could not pull off what He promised. The moment of the Transfiguration provides consolation to the three because their Faith is going to be shaken in the garden of Gethsemane where Jesus will be arrested.

We all need a Transfiguration moment at one point or another, and if we really search back in our lives, we can find times when Our Blessed Lord assured us of His presence. There are little miracles along the way. And, as we contemplate them, we realize they were not so little after all. Maybe Lent for us this year is a time to contemplate God acting in our lives and His trying to get in touch.

REFLECTION

STEWARDSHIP OF OUR DEPENDENCE ON GOD

Our first reading this Sunday tells us: "The Lord God took Abram outside and said, 'Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so,' he added, 'shall your descendants be.' Abram put his faith in the LORD, who credited it to him as an act of righteousness." *Genesis 15:5-6*

Abram was an old man, and his wife was barren when God made this promise, yet Abram had faith.

We human beings like to be in control at all times. We don't like feeling dependent upon anyone, not even God. Yet, without God's providence, we would not even exist, let alone be able to take our next breath. This is a reality that we often prefer to avoid pondering. However, it is only through consciously embracing our need for God that we find authentic human fulfillment in being God's stewards.

What situations in my life are the hardest for me to accept?

In what area of my life do I struggle most to trust God?

LORD, help me to embrace my dependence upon you, and teach me to trust in your providence, one day at a time. Amen.

What is Adoration? Jesus gives us so much, what can we give Jesus?

In adoration, I give Jesus the only thing I fully possess: my unworthiness, my wretchedness, my sins, my weaknesses.

Since we have a free will, God allows these choices that we make. These things are not from God. God only gives us what is good for us. In His eyes these things that we fully possess (all these weaknesses) have more value than our successes, which do not belong to us. All successes come from God. God is total Compassion. God would love for us to feed His Compassion by giving Him our unworthiness, our wretchedness, our sins, our weaknesses. So, in adoration, tell Jesus that you will feed Him by giving Him what is our own. And He will give you what is His. We have Adoration for everyone on Wednesdays after our 10am Mass until 3:30pm when we pray the Rosary and have Benediction, closing at 4pm.
