



REFLECTION

STEWARDSHIP AND PALMS

Palms are blessed and distributed to the faithful as sacramentals. Through the intercession of the Church, sacramentals prepare us to receive God's grace and dispose us to be guided by the Holy Spirit. While not conferring God's grace in the same way the sacraments do, sacramentals draw us closer to God . When we bring palms into our homes, we praise God and invite his blessing into our everyday lives. Displaying the palms in our homes gives witness to our faith and reminds us of the sanctify of our "Domestic Church."

Palms are a visible reminder of our reliance upon God's providence and the importance of safeguarding the holiness of our homes. We do this by loving our families unconditionally, praying together, exercising hospitality, and being mindful of the quality of outside influences we admit, including those that enter through various media.

Old palms should be burned, not placed in the trash. Our church collects them during Lent and uses the ashes to mark our foreheads on Ash Wednesday.

2023 SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: THANK YOU AND NEXT STEPS...

Synodality is a way of "journeying together" – of living out our faith – that calls for speaking and listening to one another and the Holy Spirit.

The feedback received from the diocesan consultation over the past three months (local listening sessions, individual responses, and the Pre-Synodal Assembly) will be compiled into an overall summary. This summary will serve as the Diocese of Covington's concrete contribution to the universal Synod process. It can also serve as a resource in identifying future steps on the path of synodality for our local Church.

The summary will be sent to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for compilation with the summaries received from the other dioceses of the United States. This "national" summary will contribute to the development of the working documents (*Instrumentum Laboris*) that will be studied and discerned on the continental level and then finally by the Synod of Bishops in Rome in October 2023.

Our sincere thanks to all those who coordinated, organized, and participated in the Synod consultation in the Diocese of Covington. The sharing of your faith, talents, and experiences is greatly appreciated! Please continue to pray to the Holy Spirit that the Synod on Synodality will bear fruit according to God's will for all of us, everywhere, who are the Body of Christ, the Church.

R.C.I.A.-"Do not be afraid. You are not alone."

Today we commemorate Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem...and before the week is out we will have relived his crucifixion. Pope Francis says, "Jesus's message to us today is this: 'Do not be afraid, you are not alone. I experienced all your desolation in order to be ever close to you.'

"Today, in the tragedy of a pandemic, in the face of the many false securities that have now crumbled," Francis said, "in the face of so many hopes betrayed, in the sense of abandonment that weighs upon our hearts,

Jesus says to each one of us: 'Courage, open your heart to my love. You will feel the consolation of God who sustains you'."

He told the small congregation in the basilica of some thirty persons standing at a distance from each other and the larger global audience that Jesus had "served us even to the point of being betrayed and abandoned," and that, "we were put in this world to love him and our neighbors. Everything else passes away, only this remains." (Homily of Pope Francis, Palm Sunday, April 5, 2020)

St. Bernadette Soubirous

(b. 1844 - d. 1879)

St. Bernadette was the firstborn daughter of a miller from Lourdes, and is best known for experiencing Marian apparitions of a "young lady" who instructed Bernadette to



come daily to the grotto to receive visions and she eventually proclaimed "I am the Immaculate Conception." A spring at the grotto, which appeared where Bernadette was instructed to dig, has been a site of miraculous healing. The lady also requested that a chapel be built in the grotto for pilgrims.
