

RCIA: Touching Jesus' Wounded Side



"The Lord never tires of forgiving us. It is we who tire of asking for forgiveness." (Pope Francis, March 18, 2013)
Today we celebrate Divine

Mercy Sunday. In the Gospel, we hear the Risen Lord promise his apostles, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven

them." (John 20:22-23) The apostle Thomas was absent, and since he hadn't seen Jesus he adamantly refused to believe he was alive. "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." (John 20:25) Does Jesus get angry with Thomas' lack of faith? Quite the contrary. He appears again, a week after Easter Sunday, and says to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." (John 20:27) Jesus draws us, no matter our sins or unbelief, right into his deep heart.

The image of Divine Mercy was commissioned by the Polish nun, St. Faustina, who saw Jesus in visions. It is an image inviting all of us, again and again, back to the heart of our God who loves us, even unto death. His wounded side flows with blood and water to continually cleanse us and draw us into the unshakeable peace Jesus wants us each to have.

REFLECTION

STEWARDSHIP OF THE PARADOX OF FAITH

Faith is truly a gift. We don't earn it, but we do need to nurture it. Even Thomas, one of the twelve apostles, struggled to believe what he was told about Jesus' resurrection from the dead: "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." John 20:25.

Is it any wonder that those of us who have not seen Jesus in the flesh sometimes struggle with doubt? God's goodness is beyond human understanding. Only through humility can we acknowledge and accept the incomprehensible wonder that is God. Scripture tells us: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." *Proverbs 9:10.* Fear of the Lord is the humble acceptance of our human weakness. Practicing humility and meekness is the best way to nurture our gift of faith, for our Lord tells us: "...my power is made perfect in weakness." *2 Corinthians 12:9*

May we grow in faith this Easter season as we seek to steward this great paradox.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA (b. 1347– d. 1380)

Catherine of Siena was a Dominican tertiary and mystic who lived in Italy in



the 1300s. She was known for her holiness, asceticism, and spiritual visions and was said to have received stigmata. She was also a reformer and political activist, and she was influential in religious and political affairs of the church. She was given the title of Doctor of the Church in 1970 by Pope Paul VI.



PRAY FOR LIFE: January 22, 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in Roe v. Wade that abor-





Now, in Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Health Organization, the Supreme Court is considering the constitutionality of a Mississippi Law that would protect unborn life at 15 weeks gestation,...pre-viability..." 
