

RE-SAVE THE DATE!

Why: Because the same Holy Spirit who sent forth the apostles 2000 years ago is alive and sends us forth today into a desperate world.

The day before Fr. Mike's visit, we celebrate the feast of the Visitation. Immediately after saying yes to the angel Gabriel, Our Lady “went in haste” to the hill country of Judea to visit her elderly cousin who was also miraculously with child. Rarely does Scripture tell us of Jesus or Mary doing anything in haste. The Holy Spirit must have been the wings on Mary's feet urging her towards a highly inconvenient act of kindness—the trip would have been around 80 miles one way, which Mary probably made on foot. Love, however, is rarely convenient. How is the Holy Spirit nudging you and me to love today? Where are we being *sent forth*, perhaps outside of our comfort zone?

SAINT OF THE WEEK

THE STORY OF THE VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This is a fairly late feast, going back only to the 13th or 14th century. It was established widely throughout the Church to pray for



unity. Like most feasts of Mary, it is closely connected with Jesus and his saving work. The more visible actors in the visitation drama (see Luke 1:39-45) are Mary and Elizabeth. However, Jesus and John the Baptist steal the scene in a hidden way. Jesus makes John leap with joy—the joy of messianic salvation. Elizabeth, in turn, is filled with the Holy Spirit and addresses words of praise to Mary—words that echo down through the ages. Luke is speaking for the Church, gives a prayerful poet's rendition of the scene. Elizabeth's praise of Mary as “the mother of my Lord” can be viewed as the earliest Church's devotion to Mary. As with all authentic devotion to Mary, Elizabeth's (the Church's) words first praise God for what God has done to Mary. Only secondly does she praise Mary for trusting God's words. Then comes the *Magnificat* (Luke 1:46-55). Here, Mary herself—like the Church—traces all her greatness to God.


