REFLECTION

STEWARDSHIP OF HOSPITALITY

“Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby some have entertained angels unawares.” ~ *Hebrews 13:2*

Today’s readings have much to say about one of the pillars of stewardship: hospitality. Abraham is rewarded with a son after showing hospitality to three strangers who turn out to be angels. Saint Paul reminds us of this in his letter to the Hebrews.

Jesus teaches us that hospitality is more than attending to the physical needs of others. In fact, it’s possible to focus too much on the menu, table settings, and other details, missing the opportunity to truly encounter one another. In the age of social media, presenting our best self image has largely taken the place of social interaction altogether, leaving our encounters shallow at best and sometimes competitive and even hostile.

More than ever, we need to sit at the feet of Jesus and learn what really matters.

For centuries, artists have respectfully avoided any attempt at putting a face on God by depicting the Holy Trinity as the three angels in our first reading. Probably the most famous of these depictions is by the early 15th century iconographer, Andrei Rublev. (See adjacent column). Note how each figure draws the eye, not to himself, but to one of the others.

Contemplating Rublev’s Trinity invites us to consider how we can focus more on others than on ourselves. Like the Trinity, we are called to live in love and harmony with one another, even as we remain distinctly our own persons.

How can I be a better steward of my part in the relationships that are entrusted to me? How can I treat others as I would treat Jesus?

In the wake of the Feast of the Sacred Heart, June 24, we found ourselves in the historic moment of the Supreme Court’s final decision to overturn Roe V. Wade, ending abortion on demand as we lived with for 49 years. For the past 7 years, on many Mondays after 10:00 am

Mass at Blessed Sacrament, Respect Life Members have relentlessly met to make the trek to Planned Parenthood to pray for an hour to end abortion. Here is an account from one of our members...

“Normally when we first arrived at Planned Parenthood, we would borrow a sign from Ray, who was always there faithfully, a man who dedicated his life daily to end abortion. We would pray three mysteries of the rosary and a Divine Mercy Chaplet while wearing signs in support of the life of the babies and their mothers...June 27th was different. We were a little unsure about what we would find in terms of friendly or angry people...As we crested the hill, we noticed a cluster of people standing at the far entrance to the parking lot. We didn't recognize anyone...if they were pro-life or pro-choice, until we saw a young man dressed in black with a white collar (a seminarian). We breathed a sigh of relief and walked toward them. They were so excited to announce that the clinic had closed for surgical abortions. They asked for continued prayers for those women who were coming for chemical abortions or for a referral to another place where they could get abortions... Give God all glory and praise, and give thanks to our Blessed Mother, St. Michael and St. Joseph. It was victory day, and we were giddy with joy!”

SAINT OF THE WEEK

**ST. BRIDGET OF SWEDEN
(c. 1303 - July 23, 1373)**

From age 7 on, Bridget had visions of Christ crucified. Her visions formed the basis for her activity—always with the emphasis on charity rather than spiritual favors.

She lived her married life in the court of the Swedish king Magnus II. Mother of eight children—the second eldest was Saint Catherine of Sweden—

Bridget lived the strict life of a penitent after her husband’s death.

Bridget constantly strove to exert her good influence over Magnus; while never fully reforming, he did give her land and buildings to found a monastery for men and women. This group eventually expanded into an Order known as the Bridgetines.

A final pilgrimage to the Holy Land, marred by shipwreck and the death of her son, Charles, eventually led to her death in 1373. In 1999, Bridget, Saint Catherine of Siena and Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, were named co-patronesses of Europe.



THE ALLIANCE FOR CATHOLIC URBAN EDUCATION (ACUE)

is a group of six urban elementary schools within the Diocese of Covington: **Holy Cross-Latonia, Holy Family-Covington, Holy Trinity (Bellevue & Newport), Prince of Peace-Covington, St. Anthony-Taylor Mill, St. Augustine-Covington.** It was formally organized in 2006 by Bishop Roger Foys to increase the efficiency of the schools and make sure that a quality Catholic education is available for all children. It is found that students graduate from ACUE schools with a good academic foundation for high school, self-discipline and a strong sense of community; they benefit from smaller class sizes, personal attention and family-like atmosphere; peaceful, structured school environments give students a sense of stability. BE READY FOR GOD TO “STOP BY”

In my experience, most people can be divided into two groups: those who are old enough to remember when you kept food on hand for company, and those who aren't.

For those of you in the latter group, let me explain. Before text messaging and social media made us all unconditionally, mercilessly reachable, people would do this thing called “stopping by.” They would be passing by a friend's house, maybe on the way home from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatsoever. “I was just in the neighborhood,” they would say. I remember my mother and I would do this on many a Saturday. It wasn't an everyday occurrence, but it was common enough that you had to be ready.

“Crazy,” you might exclaim. “People just appeared on your doorstep? How did you cope

with the uncertainty?” Well, most of us had moms who kept a little something on hand to eat or drink that was extra nice, just in case anyone stopped by. That way, we were always ready.

Today's readings are about a lot of things: prayer, hope, redemptive suffering. They're about what it means to be a Christian, and not just what it means to do Christian things.

Most of all, though, they're about readiness. If God showed up at your door, would you be ready for Him? Would you be ready for what He gives you, or what He takes away? Would you be ready for Him to interrupt the plans you have for yourself? To disrupt the idea you carry in your mind of what a servant or a steward is supposed to be?

Read your Bible. Say your rosary. Go to Mass. Get to Confession. Talk to God — every day, not just when you think you need Him. That way, you are always ready.

This time of year, I attend a lot of weddings. Why do Catholic weddings need to take place in a church?

Technically, there is a clause in Church law that could allow for weddings to take place outside of a church, in a suitable space under special circumstances, but it requires the rare permission of the bishop. But the meaning of marriage goes very, very deep, and the Church has a vested interest in protecting that meaning. As Catholics, we don't see a wedding as an event that needs a pleasing backdrop.

Marriage is a sacrament, both an occasion of joyful promise and symbolic solemnity. It is a spiritual event. The loving bond of marriage symbolizes the mystical union between Christ and his Church. The man and woman profess lifelong vows of fidelity, and they receive supernatural grace from God to keep their promises. Receiving the sacrament of Marriage in a church has broader symbolic meaning for the couple as well. Marriage isn't simply

two people in isolation from the world around them. Marriage is the joining of families and the beginning of a new, holy mission in the life of the couple. Weddings are sacred occasions, and it's fitting that they occur in sacred spaces.
