Eternal Rest is a 4-part video-based series with prayer and discussion.

Our Lenten series is a 4-session mini retreat that takes us into Catholic theology of death, the afterlife, forgiveness of sins, salvation through Jesus Christ, heaven, hell, purgatory, particular judgment, general judgment, sacrament of the sick, the Mystical Body of Christ, the Communion of Saints, and more.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

OUR LADY OF LOURDES

On December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in the apostolic constitution *Ineffabilis Deus*. A little more than three years later, on February 11, 1858, a young lady appeared to

Bernadette Soubirous. This began a series of visions. During the apparition on March 25, the lady identified herself with the words: "I

identified herself with the words: "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Through that humble girl, Bernadette, Mary revitalized and continues to revitalize the faith of millions of people. People began to flock to Lourdes from other parts of France and from all over the world. In 1862 Church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions and authorized the cult of Our Lady of Lourdes for the diocese. The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes became worldwide in 1907
