REFLECTION**TIME, TALENT, AND TREASURE**

The word "stewardship" is frequently associated with money, but there's so much more to it than that. Everything we have is a blessing from God: each moment of each day, each talent or skill, the wealth we accumulate from using our time and talent—everything. Talents can and should be developed. Treasure can and should be earned and used responsibly. Time can and should be spent wisely. That is what we mean by stewardship.

Stewardship and discipleship go hand in hand. Being a follower of Jesus Christ entails recognizing what has been entrusted to us and using it for the glory of God. How we do this is a matter of conscience. Finding the right balance requires ongoing discernment because our life circumstances frequently change. At some point in our lives, we may have more time and talent than treasure. At other times, we may have treasure but little discretionary time. Whatever our circumstances, God is our first priority. Without a healthy relationship with our LORD, we cannot hope to maintain the healthy balance of a good disciple.

Lent is a good time to take inventory of how we are stewarding our blessings.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. GILES MARY OF ST.

JOSEPH (November 16, 1729 – February 7, 1812)

St. Giles Mary was born in Taranto to very poor parents. His father's death left the 18-year-old St. Giles Mary to care for the family. Having secured their future, he entered the Friars Minor at Galatone in 1754. For 53 years, he served at St. Paschal's Hospice in Naples in various roles, such as cook, porter, or most often as official beggar for that community.

"Love God, love God" was his characteristic phrase as he gathered food for the friars and shared some of his bounty with the poor—all the while consoling the troubled and urging everyone to repent. The charity which he reflected on the streets of Naples was born in prayer and nurtured in the common life of the friars. The people whom Giles Mary met on his begging rounds nicknamed him the "Consoler of Naples." He was canonized in 1996

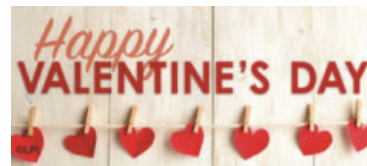
