

CANNONBALL YEAR

This year the Society of Jesus celebrates the "Cannonball Year." For those who have been around the Society of Jesus long enough, the story of Ignatius of Loyola's conversion is well known. During a losing battle, his leg was severely damaged by a cannonball, and he was taken away to recuperate.

It took nine months for Ignatius to recover, not because his injury was so bad, but because of his pride. Ignatius underwent multiple surgeries because, ultimately, he wanted to look good in the fancy clothes fashionable in courts of the era, ascend to power, and win the hand of a regal lady. It is amazing what attachment to things like personal ambition and beauty can cause us to do.

Fortunately, during this time, God never left him. During his recovery, Ignatius began to grow restless, so he distracted himself with thoughts of the amazing feats of heroism he would perform upon his return to full strength. When his own imagination was not enough, Ignatius asked for books to read that might help pass the time. He wanted books about Lords and Ladies and valiant deeds, but what he got was a copy of the "Life of Christ" and "The Lives of the Saints." Being who he was, Ignatius began to put himself in competition with those who had done great things for Christ, imagining the feats he would be capable of performing if he followed the Lord.

A strange thing started to happen. As Ignatius thought of doing great things for Christ, he was left with a sense of peace, joy, and consolation. When he thought of doing things for himself, however, he was left with a sense of agitation and restlessness. This was, for him, the experience that changed his life and the foundation for what would become the "discernment of spirits". Ignatius began realizing that he was choosing the wrong things to love, and the wrong king to follow. Ignatius began to allow himself to be led in a new way.

For each of us, there is an awareness of the points in our own lives when we experience conversion, times when we have to make a choice about which Spirit we are going to cultivate in our lives: the Spirit of God or the spirit of the world. The Cannonball year is all about being open to letting God break into our lives and lead us down new paths. This is a year of hope, a year of conversion, and ultimately a year of learning how to be a better disciple of Christ.

Caring for our Church

The restoration of our church's belltower and eaves is underway! Prior to my arrival as Pastor, it became apparent that the clock tower and box-gutters on our church need to be repaired. This work was delayed in part due to the changing of pastors and in part due to the pandemic lockdown. As it stands, the work is slated to be finished sometime in late November or early December. Please pray for the health and safety of all who are involved in this massive undertaking.

The planned restoration will address specific structural issues that have led to leaking and water damage, and it will also attend to the tower's edifice. The first stage of these necessary repairs will be to shore up any places outside where water might be entering the church. During the second stage, work will move inside to scrape away damaged material and refinish our beloved interior.

St. Xavier church is our place of prayer, our spiritual home. As with repairing any home, there may be times of inconvenience, and more than a little dust raised up. As work progresses from the outside to the inside, the parish staff is committed to keeping you updated. We look forward to a completed exterior restoration (first stage) by the end of this liturgical year!


