“Do Whatever He Tells You”

We live in a world where no one wants to be told what to do. It seems every suggestion gives rise to rebellion. It is as if we are all toddlers screaming, “You can’t tell me what to do!” What child development professionals call the stage of individualism for a growing infant we continue to find in adult life. Societal structures have given way to rampant individualism without regard to the common good or upon whom this self-proclaimed freedom may tread. Surely there are some valid reasons not to heed the command to “do what you are told,” especially where it goes against human dignity and the rights of the individual. The various issues and topics which dot our headlines cause us to ask, “to whom do I listen?” We are in constant search of the something, or the someone we can be certain possess the truth; on the person whose words will not lead us astray.

These past few weeks we have been given an opportunity to reflect on just such a person. Our liturgical celebrations have been sown together to form a single thread. Amid all the celebrations, grand and familiar music, talk of angels on high and kings from the East, the heavens opening, and the thunderous voice of God the Father, we come today to a wedding feast. Since Christmas we have rejoiced that a tiny baby was born of a lowly girl. The infant, heralded by the angels was the Son of the Most High. Shepherds came at the angels bidding to give him homage. Magi brought him gifts and returned home telling of the fulfillment of their prophecies. The child was presented in the Temple and the prophetess Anna foretold of his greatness. John the Baptizer tells us that Jesus is the Anointed One of God. Our heavenly Father speaks that Jesus is his beloved Son in whom he is well please. All these manifestations set the stage for the story today at the wedding feast of Cana where Jesus performs his first miraculous sign: turning water into wine.

Why all this fuss, all this prelude? The Scripture authors and the Church Fathers who ordered the readings for our liturgies want to cast away any doubt as to who this Jesus is. Now, at this wedding feast we hear the words that focus our attention to the mystery of Christ in a way no other can. We hear Mary, our beloved Blessed Mother tell us in her last recorded words, “Do whatever he tells you.”

Isn't it a shame that even her words are not heeded? Worse yet is when the very person whom we seek, the one who has the only living words, the words that can guide our hearts, minds, and actions, is ignored. Mary's command is not a request, her last words, her “mic drop” if you will, are the words in which every Christian is called into being. If you are still making resolutions for the New Year, listen to Mary—listen to Jesus and “do whatever he tells you.”
