Signs, political ads, radio programs all have seemingly stored up over three years of debate, arguments, deliberations over every issue that has a political angle to it. It seems now is the time for us to be asked to endure this abundance of information. It always seems that one side or the other is prepared to tell everything bad about the other and vice-a-versa. I think that the best way I know to come to grips with the constant bantering is to just remember that there is a marketing strategy behind every thing you see and hear.

As Catholic citizens, faithful to our Catholic faith we have a duty to participate in the political process which has such an important role in the lives of God's people. The rhetoric to one degree or another, is a part of a marketing process. Political rhetoric rarely would qualify as totally truthful or totally non-truthful. Politics is all about, making the other's product less attractive and drive up the perception of the product you most prefer, making it seemingly impossible to do without.

Catholic teaching is clear on many social issues and we must find ways to support those teachings. However as Catholics, we should adopt a non-partisan call to focus on the dignity of all people, even when we disagree, and to put faith in action by bearing witness to compassion and civility.

While politicians come and go, issues come and go, we must always remember community. Each person is a beloved child of God and should be treated with respect because of our inherent human dignity. We have a long tradition of putting our faith in action through engagement in the political process. But lets not allow the vitriolic rhetoric you hear to turn you and others off from engaging in the public square, and more importantly turning off the love we have for our neighbor.
