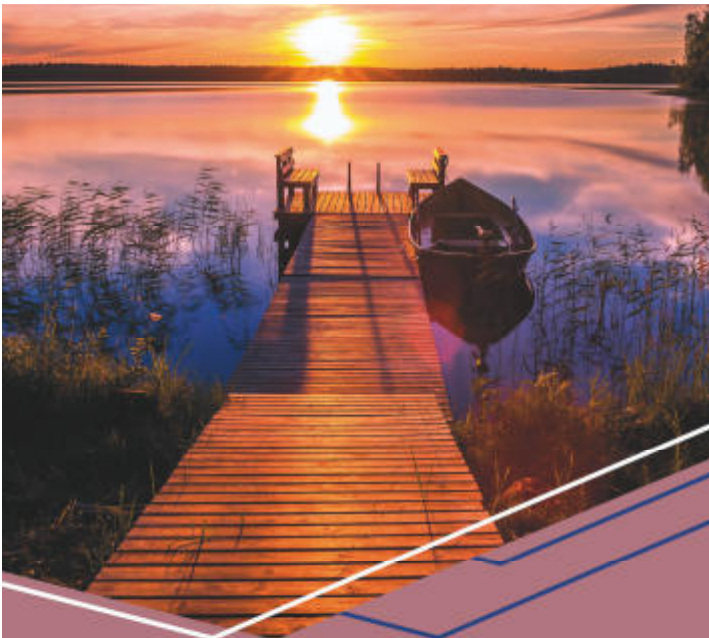

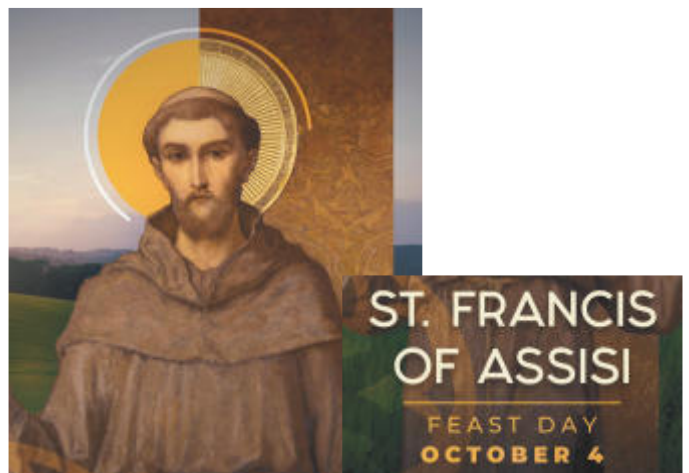

October is Respect Life Month. All life: preborn, young, elderly, alien, needy, successful, unemployed, struggling—ALL LIFE. Not so coincidentally, it is also the month of the Rosary. The Rosary is a celebration of life. We have many public recitation of the Rosary at our Parishes. Saint John every Sunday before the 8:30 Mass, the Rosary is recited. Every Friday at Saint William, we recite the Rosary during Exposition after the morning Mass and we recite the Rosary prior to every Sunday Mass at Saint William.

I highly recommend reciting the Rosary daily, taking in each of the mysteries, the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries. We journey through the Gospel, who is Jesus Christ, The complete Rosary through its mysteries brings us on the journey, the journey that is depicted in the mysteries from the Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel in the first Joyful mystery, through the Fifth Glorious mystery where Jesus crowns His mother, our Blessed Mother, Regina Caeli, Queen of Heaven! a creature like you and me: the preborn, young, elderly, alien, needy, successful, unemployed, struggling, ALL LIFE.

The journey of our Lord through the mysteries, the mysteries of His infancy and youth (*Joyful*), the mysteries of His life's mission (*Luminus*), His struggle and completion of His earthly mission (*Sorrowful*) and the eschatological reward for eternity (*Glorious*). The journey with Jesus is the blueprint for our own lives. That is why life is so precious, each persons journey brings glory to Our Lord from which all blessings flow. So, after all the arguments, all the science debates, all the politics, all the legal talk; that is the reason we are prolife; that's why we celebrate life.

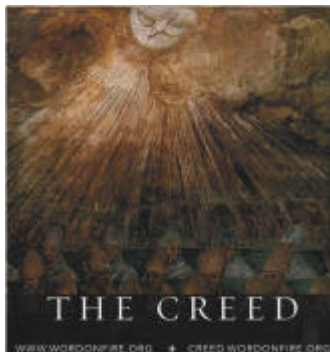
