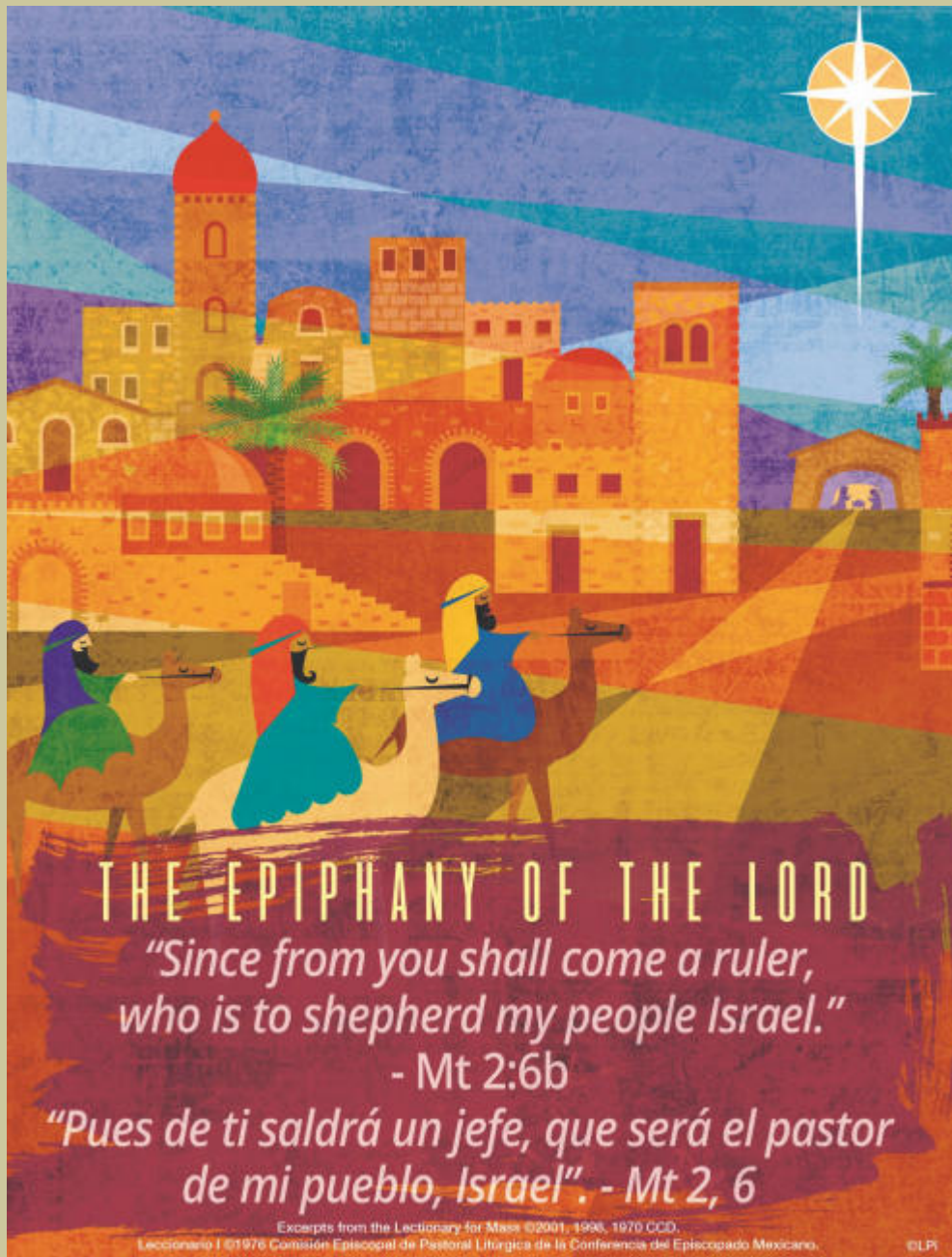

Dear Friends,

HAPPY NEW YEAR!

I am sure that all of you will join me in praying to Almighty God that 2022 is a lot better than 2021. The most frightening thing about that sentiment, of course, is that we prayed the same thing LAST year! I am sure that most of us thought that surely 2021 wouldn't be anywhere near as bad as the year before! Wow! We were sure wrong about that! Please join me in not only praying for this year to be better but doing all that we can to take care and be respectful of one another to make 2022 a much better year!

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. This feast, as you probably know, is a celebration of the manifestation of God's divinity in our everyday world. Jesus, of course, was the ultimate manifestation of God's love and power breaking into this world in the form of a baby born to poor parents who did not have a place to stay.

This story of the Magi from the East gives us some insight into how to look for God manifested today. First, they were seekers. They had a deep hunger for something bigger than themselves (As Jesus said, if we want to experience the presence of God we need to keep on seeking, keep on asking, and keep on knocking). Second, they paid attention in their searching to the physical world. They searched the night sky and saw a star that was bigger than they have ever seen, and they followed it. They got to Israel and kept on talking to people, kept on asking questions, and kept on following the star until they found Him. Third, they were open to God speaking to them – especially in dreams. Once they acknowledged Jesus as a King who is both Divine and Human through their gifts, their minds and souls were open enough to receive the message through a dream to avoid Herod. When the text says that they returned to their country “another way” it also meant that once they experienced the manifested God, they didn't go home the same way they came. They were CHANGED.

Now that the Christmas Season is coming to an end, we are very much reminded that God is HERE. Emmanuel is surely “God with Us”! To experience that Divine presence, however, it would be wise to let the Magi help to “Point the Way”. To find and live in that love and peace, we too need to SEEK it. As Psalm 80 said (on the 4th Sunday of Advent), “Lord, make us turn to you, let us see your face, and we shall be saved”. We need to pay attention for signs of God in our physical world, in nature, in the cosmos, and in people. Finally, we need to be open to change. What have we learned about ourselves in the past year that will motivate us to bring helpful changes to our lives in the New Year?

One thing that could really help us all grow spiritually in the upcoming year is our Winter Wednesday programs that begin on January 5th. Starting that evening at 7 pm in the Holy Family Center, we will provide 8 straight Wednesday evenings of presentations on types of prayer and spiritual growth. Please check our bulletin or website for details. Please note that Fr. Bernie Owens SJ will present on January 19th and Sr. Joanne Mary Frania SND will present on January 26th – NOT the other way around as previously advertised. Please mark your calendars for the next 8 Wednesdays and plan to join us this coming Wednesday for our opening program on “Discerning Your Role in the Church”.

May God bless all of you and your loved ones as we begin this new year. Please join me in doing all that we can to MAKE 2022 a better year.

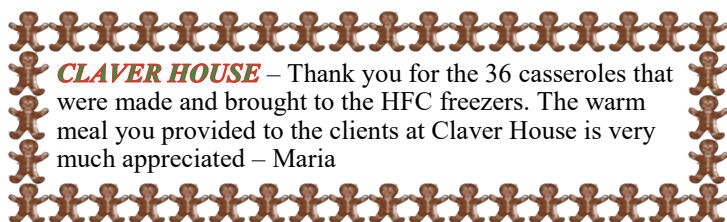

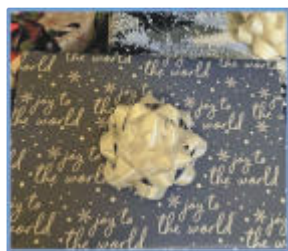

Happy New Year! I hope your Christmas was filled with joy, peace and love. Our staff and students have hopefully been enjoying their time away from the ever so busy routine of daily school life.

As we begin this new year, it is an opportunity to reflect on the accomplishments of 2021 and set goals for 2022. As one determines their goals, how often does one reflect on their gifts? With the Epiphany being celebrated on January 6th perhaps gifts are an intriguing topic.

Epiphany is celebrated 12 days after Christmas on 6th January, and is the time when Christians remember the Wise Men (also sometimes called the Three Kings) who visited Jesus. It is well known that the Three Kings brought gifts. The three gifts had a spiritual meaning: gold as a symbol of kingship on earth, frankincense (an incense) as a symbol of deity, and myrrh (an embalming oil) as a symbol of death. This dates back to Origin in Contra Celsum: "gold, as to a king; myrrh, as to one who was mortal; and incense, as to a God."

God has gifted each of us with unique talents and abilities so as to fulfill the mission He has for us. What are your gifts and how are you using them to fulfill your purpose? How do your gifts spread His light to others?

We are in GREAT need of catechists for this wonderful ministry.

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION (Wed., Sept-May; K-6; catechism for parish students enrolled in public school; 6:15-7:30): FFF students are eligible to participate in parish sports programs. Contact the Athletic Board (number on front page of bulletin) for information about the current sport season. A Homeschooling option is also available if there is a temporary sport conflict or health issue. The registration form and more information are available on the website and in the parish office.

SUNDAY PRESCHOOL (11:30 Mass; Sept.-May; ages 3^{1/2} -5 and potty trained): We use the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd model (www.cgusa.org).

RCIA for CHILDREN: If your child(ren) need to "catch up" on Sacraments, please contact me.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD (11:30 Mass; K-4; Sept-May): Being a catechist for this is a GREAT way to be involved in the spiritual development of your child; PREP IS EASY. Dismissal is from the church during Mass. (All catechist positions-FFF, preschool, CLW- require a background check, and completion of an on-line Protecting Youth course. See Mary in the parish office for details.)

FIRST EUCHARIST: Sunday, May 1st, 2022; 2pm; church

Confirmation: Confirmation 2022 will be on Wednesday April 27th; 7pm at Rosary Cathedral. Confirmation at St. Patrick's is conferred in the spring of the 8th grade year at the earliest, but older students are welcome. Mandatory preparation is in the preceding fall and winter months. Contact me in September for more information.

If your child is brand new to religious formation or has been away for more than 2 years and you are seeking preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist or Confirmation, a foundational year of religious education is required before Sacramental prep will begin.

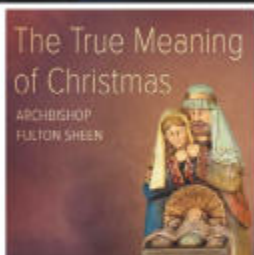

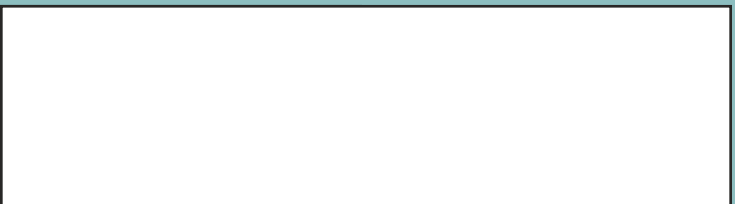
