**NEWS FROM JOINT
PASTORAL COUNCIL/FINANCE COUNCIL**

COVID, MAINTENANCE NEEDS, AND PROPERTIES DISCUSSED

In Attendance: Margret Steyer, John Gabel, Dustin Humphrey, Tim Kimmet, Andy Brickner, Greg Siebenaller, John Walter, Steve Kimmet, Brad Zoeller, Greg Arbogast, Dan Borer, Lucas Brickner, Allen Reinhart.

News of resurging cases of Covid in the area were discussed. After much discussion it was agreed that we should discontinue the use of the Eucharistic Cup for now. We should encourage people to come to Mass using their own good judgment and knowing we strive to create a safe environment for all. Those who feel most comfortable wearing a mask should be free to wear a mask. If mask and/or vaccine mandates come from the Diocese or local authorities, then we will adjust. Tim was asked to address this with the community at all Masses over the coming weeks and to call us all to continued *Kindness, Concern, and Respect*.

Maintenance needs were discussed. Tuck pointing on the front of the school building, and storm window repair on the church are the primary concerns. The Diocese has placed a fund-raising moratorium across the whole diocese over the next 3 years, while it is engaged in a \$65 million dollar Diocesan Campaign. Our participation in that campaign will take place in 2023. More news on that to come. Our own maintenance needs will need to be addressed through either -a bank loan, -the monthly maintenance envelopes, -or designated gifts to the maintenance needs/capital improvements. It was approved to contract for the tuck pointing of the Northeast corner of the building that is most in need of attention. We have funds available for that project.

Some discussion followed on the properties in Bascom, Alvada and Frenchtown. The longer the buildings set empty the more quickly they will deteriorate and lose value. Each property also has some land associated with it. Alvada and Frenchtown has farmland currently being leased, Bascom has land that could possibly be developed. While there is no plan at this time to move forward on the sale or development of any property, some informal interest has been expressed in some of the properties. It was recommended by both Councils to enlist the aide of a realtor to investigate each property to learn the fair market value of all the properties entrusted to us. No steps have been taken to relegate the buildings, (a formal canonical process which would be needed if they were ever to be sold). An ongoing discussion of the care of these properties will continue.

Cemeteries...

One of the Corporal Works of Mercy is: To Bury the Dead. We are blessed with the opportunity to practice this work of mercy in the care and upkeep of all 5 of our cemeteries. It is our privilege to care for these sacred grounds and it's inspiring to see so many of you who visit the cemeteries expressing your love and continued care for those who have gone before us.

Please note that all of our cemeteries close at dark, including St Andrew, St Boniface, St Nicholas, St Patrick, and St Peter. It has been brought to our attention that some vehicles and persons have been seen after dark and late into the evening at one or more of our sites. We urge all our parishioners and families to attend to our regulations both for personal safety and respect for our Faithful Departed. If you have any questions please do call the office and ask for Steve

Next, decorating each gravesite is a wonderful opportunity to honor our dearly departed. Please note that our Cemetery Handbook addresses this topic as follows:

10. Trees, shrubs, and plants cannot be planted by lot-holders; but bouquets in vases, plants in pots, or a large flower vase are allowed, provided they are movable and are placed in line with the monuments. Decorations should not be placed behind the monument/grave. No balloon launches will be permitted in the cemeteries.

11. Flowers, decorations, etc. must be removed by the 5th Sunday of Lent. Any flowers, decorations, etc. on monuments after the 5th Sunday of Lent will be discarded. Flowers and decorations, etc. may be put back on monuments Palm Sunday. Grave blankets must be removed by March 1.

Again, if you have any specific questions please call the office.

It is anticipated that these regulations will be updated in the near future to align with other local cemeteries as well as those provided by the Diocese. Please watch for additional messages on this topic.

Thinking of joining the Roman Catholic Church?

Great! Where to start?

Well, just begin where you are **now!**

Many adults entering the Catholic Church, or those just thinking about it, follow a process known as the **RCIA** — the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The RCIA process has several distinct stages. These Catholic RCIA stages are **a good model** of faith development itself, so this article will fit you whether or not you're actually in the RCIA process.


- **Inquiry:** the initial period before you decide to enter the Catholic Church. You're asking questions and checking it out, but aren't yet ready to commit.

- **Catechumenate:** those who decide to enter the Church and are being trained for a life in Christ are called *catechumens*, an ancient name from the early Church. In this stage, you're developing your faith and are being "catechized" — learning catechism, or the basic points about Catholic faith and life.

- **Purification and preparation:** The Church will help you focus and intensify your faith as you prepare to commit your life to Christ and be received into the Church at Easter. If you're following the RCIA process, you'll go through a beautiful series of Gospel-based meditations during Lent, which is the time frame of this period.

- **Initiation** itself, the culmination of the whole process! You're received into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass, where you'll receive the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. (If you've already been Baptized, you won't be baptized again.)

- **Mystagogy:** after reception into the Church at Easter, this period lets you reflect and learn more about the mysteries of the Mass and the Sacraments that you now participate in fully.



Give it all Back



Pop culture has given us a unique idea of the term justice. Justice, we often think, is about taking. Taking what's owed. Taking revenge. Taking what we deserve. This worldview tends

to make mincemeat of our Catholic social teachings. Seeking the good of the poor, a call to community and participation, solidarity — on the face of it, in a society where everything must be earned and we are encouraged to hoard for ourselves whatever success we can achieve, these principles look a lot like highway robbery.

But when you remember the presence of an omnipotent, all-loving and all-merciful God, it turns our gun-slitting sense of justice on its head. For how does justice inhabit the same universe as a God who is so quick to give and indeed to forgive?

Well, very easily, when we remember Who exactly is the source of every good and perfect thing in this world. There is no law that cannot be traced back to the Word. And the Word saves our souls.

Is that justice? No, that is a gift. It is the reckless, indulgent gift of a father whose love is greater than His anger. What is justice in the Biblical sense?

The answer is simple. Look at your life. See the hours in your day? See your spouse, your kids, your grandkids? See the house they live in, the money in your wallet, the food in your fridge, the breath in your lungs?

Calling it all your own, refusing to share any of it — that's robbery. Giving it all back to the One who gave it to you — that's justice.

Sharing Your Faith

Question:

My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?

Answer:

There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns.

Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you! ©LPi


