THE ESTATE OF MIKE KIMMET

We have a great deal to be thankful for in the gift of Mike Kimmet's estate. It is a great reminder about "planned giving", and the legacy that can be left to strengthen the work of your local parish, when you remember the church in your estate planning.

After prayerful discussion with the Finance Council, it has been determined that the parish will "tithe" 2.5% of the estate, (which equals a little over \$10,000) to a charitable cause, still to be determined.

Of the remaining funds, one half (\$197,297.50) will be invested in order to keep our cash reserves strong, and able to support future growth and unforeseen ministry needs.

The other half (\$197,297.50) will be made available for current maintenance needs that we have been holding off on, due to lack of adequate funds on hand. These include tuck pointing of the parish hall/school building, and replacement of storm glass windows in the Church building.

The diocese has requested a "moratorium on fund raising", (except for the Annual Catholic Appeal, (ACA), which has hindered us from coming to you for your contributions toward these regular major expenses, that occur in the life of every parish community. Mike Kimmet's estate aides us greatly in meeting these existing needs, and we will be able to seek your needed support in the coming years for the financial support needed to renew our facilities and to strengthen the staffing and visionary goals of our parish family.

Thanks to Mike Kimmet for his leadership and his example of generous stewardship and to each of you for your ongoing generosity and support.

Level 1 Snow Emergency-

Use extreme caution. Masses will be celebrated at all worship sites.

Elderly are advised not to attend Masses.

Level 2 Snow Emergency—

Necessary travel only.

Elderly should not attend Mass.

All weekday Masses/Services will be cancelled

WINTER WEEKDAY PARKING REQUEST

During the winter months we request that parishioners park in the North parking lot when attending weekday Masses. This will allow the snow/ice removal team to focus on that lot to ensure a safe walking surface early in the mornings.

Level 3 Snow Emergency—

Emergency vehicles only. All others will be arrested. Check local media, parish website and friends for any other Mass information.

All scheduled Masses will be cancelled at all worship sites—Saturday Vigil, Sunday, Holy Day and weekday Masses.

Level 3 Snow Emergency Guidelines for the Diocese of Toledo—Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.



Inspiration for the week

Jesus stood in line with everyone else and was baptized. There is something incredibly humbling about how this must have played out. Then, God did something truly awesome and inspiring. Through a very gentle and simple action he let the world know about the special relationship He shares with Jesus. That's exactly what is so incredible about our baptisms as well! Through those holy waters God announces to the world the special place we also occupy in His heart. We no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. We do not need to fumble around, tripping over ourselves and wondering why we are even here. The answer has been given. All we have to do is live out the vocation we have received, to live the Gospel in fidelity to our Creator. There is nothing to fear and worry has no place. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor and God is very pleased.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.
