

From the Pastor's Desk *This weekend's Gospel continues marching through Matthew chapter thirteen, a nonstop boxing combination of parables. These parables in quick succession are hard hitting, fast and deceptively deep. The first two parables from today's Gospel both relate to a pearl or treasure of great price.*

The pearl or treasure found in our parables, the early church fathers understood as the life changing perspective of eternity and living for Heaven, of knowing that we have a God that dies for the chance to get to know us in relationship. Once we realize, or experience that life changing love, we have a choice to make, sacrifice for the future or live for today. Like everything worth pursuing, relationship with God is all consuming.

Take a moment and think back to those first clumsy steps in love, the entire world seemed to fade into the background as we pursued a new reality. Same is true as we experienced parenthood for the first time. In pursuing a vocation to religious life or the priesthood, the rest of the world, while still there, was secondary to what I was experiencing in formation. Ordination like marriage was another moment of grace changing my perspective forever.

I am very much a romantic, I throw all of myself at something worthy of my life, there is no safety net, no reserve parachute, God designed my heart to be all in. So, when I read scripture like these parables I always stop and pray about the state of my heart. If you have time, please bring these same questions into your prayer life this week.

Am I all in?

Am I pursuing God and letting the rest of the world fade into background noise?

Am I living detached from the world around me?

Am I sacrificing for the others?

Am I falling more in love with God?
