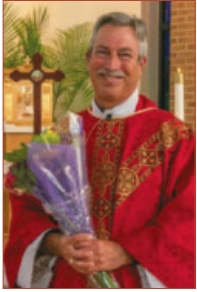

BLESSINGS

Those of us in Holy Orders are regularly asked to give blessings. A blessing is an act of sanctification and may be given to a person, a place or an object designated for a sacred purpose. At every Mass, for example, there is a blessing over the congregation before the dismissal. At a wedding, the officiant

blesses the rings and also gives the Nuptial Blessing to the couple. Perhaps, among the most common requests would be to bless a rosary, a statue or another article of devotion such as a crucifix. Over the past twenty-seven years, I have enjoyed this aspect of pastoral ministry.

Last week, I was invited to bless a restaurant, El Veracruz, which just happens to be in the original parish church at 761 N. Main St. here in Mooresville. The owners and staff were very kind and hospitable during the visit and blessing. We have many families who have moved to the area long after the diocese sold the old church property about 33 years ago. I was never actually in the old church when it was an active parish, but I have been there several times as a patron of the Mexican restaurant, which is at least the fourth restaurant to use the building. If you've never been to El Veracruz, I certainly recommend it for great Mexican cuisine and the opportunity to see part of our parish history.

As I blessed their lovely and unique restaurant, I thought of the many places and experiences that I have had as a priest of the Church for blessings, Masses and visits. Some of these experiences I would never have dreamed of during my years of formation.

For example, I have blessed families, cars, bicycles, buses, boats, dogs, cats, horses, homes, restaurants, classrooms, and even a *tortilleria* (where they make many tortillas). I have celebrated Masses in parishes, schools, basilicas, shrines, cathedrals, homes, hotels, fields, prisons, and on cruise ships in the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. I have also had the great experience of celebrating Masses at such holy places as the House of Mary in Ephesus, at the Chapel of Tepeyac in



Mexico where our Lady of Guadalupe gave the roses to St. Juan Diego, at the Grotto of Lourdes in France, at Our Lady of Knock in Ireland, at the mission of San Juan Capistrano in California, at the Site of the Apparitions in Fatima, at the altar and tomb of Pope St. John Paul II in St. Peter's, at the great Basilica of St. Anne de Beaupré in Canada, at the tomb of our Lord in Jerusalem, and at the site of the Annunciation to Mary in Nazareth.

As a priest, I have visited mansions, apartments, trailers, jails, coal and copper mines, farms and ranches, monasteries, convents, vineyards, tobacco fields, the Apostolic Palace of the Vatican and even the Nunciature (like an embassy) in Washington, D.C. I have prayed in the cave on the island of

Patmos where the beloved disciple, St. John, received the vision for the Book of Revelation. I have prayed invocations at dinners, banquets, ecumenical services, meetings of the City Council and the County Commissioners, and even at an NFL game. I participated in an exorcism in Mexico, which was quite shocking to me. I have baptized thousands and officiated hundreds of weddings and funerals and given blessings to couples on anniversaries of all lengths: 25, 40, 50, 60, and even 70 years! I have prayed the Rosary with parishioners in many parishes, with religious sisters,

with children, and with a saint (JP II). As a priest, I have been to mountains, beaches and jungles, to the top of church towers and cupolas, and down to subterranean catacombs and crypts. I once prayed the Liturgy of the Hours on the top of a Mayan pyramid in Mexico that had once been a place of human sacrifices to the sun. I have been to a great number of hospitals, nursing homes, hospice units, cemeteries, and even to a few morgues for sacraments and blessings. I have been to the tombs of several saints, including the St. Junípero Serra in Carmel, St. Andre in Montreal, St. Catherine Labouré, St. Vincent de Paul, Sts. Peter and Paul in Rome, and that of my own patron, St. Mark, in Venice. These years have been quite fulfilling.

LAS BENDICIONES:

A diáconos, sacerdotes, y obispos se les pide regularmente que den bendiciones. Una bendición es un acto de santificación y se puede dar a una persona, un lugar o un objeto designado para un propósito sagrado. En cada Misa, por ejemplo, se bendice a la congregación antes de la despedida. En una boda, el oficiante bendice los anillos y también da la Bendición Nupcial a la pareja. Quizás, entre las peticiones más comunes estaría la de bendecir un rosario, una estatua u otro artículo de devoción como un crucifijo. Durante los últimos veintisiete años, he disfrutado este aspecto del ministerio pastoral.

La semana pasada, me invitaron a bendecir un restaurante, El Veracruz, que compró la iglesia parroquial original en 761 N. Main St. aquí en Mooresville. Los propietarios y el personal fueron muy amables y hospitalarios durante la visita y la bendición. Tenemos muchas familias que se han mudado al área mucho después de que la diócesis vendiera la antigua propiedad de la iglesia hace unos 33 años. En realidad, nunca estuve en la antigua iglesia cuando era una parroquia activa, pero he estado allí varias veces como patrocinador del restaurante mexicano, que es al menos el cuarto restaurante en usar el edificio. Si nunca ha estado en El Veracruz, sin duda lo recomiendo por la excelente cocina mexicana y la oportunidad de ver parte de la historia de nuestra parroquia.

Mientras bendecía su encantador y único restaurante, pensé en los muchos lugares y experiencias que he tenido como sacerdote de la Iglesia para bendiciones, misas y visitas. Algunas de estas experiencias nunca las hubiera soñado durante mis años de formación.

Por ejemplo, he bendecido familias, carros, bicicletas, buses, botes, perros, gatos, caballos, casas, restaurantes, salones de clases y hasta una tortillería (donde hacen muchas tortillas). He celebrado Misas en parroquias, escuelas, basílicas, santuarios, catedrales, casas, hoteles, campos, prisiones y en cruceros en los océanos Atlántico y Pacífico. También he tenido la gran experiencia de celebrar Misas en lugares tan sagrados como la Casa de María en Éfeso, en la Capilla del Tepeyac en México

donde Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe entregó las rosas a San Juan Diego, en la Gruta de Lourdes en Francia, en Nuestra Señora de Knock en Irlanda, en la misión de San Juan Capistrano en California, en el Sitio de las Apariciones en Fátima, en el altar y la tumba del Papa San Juan Pablo II en San Pedro, en la gran Basílica de Santa Ana de Beaupré en Canadá, en la tumba de nuestro Señor en Jerusalén, y en el lugar de la Anunciación a María en Nazaret.

Como sacerdote he visitado mansiones, apartamentos, caravanas, cárceles, minas de carbón y cobre, haciendas y ranchos, monasterios, conventos, viñedos, campos de tabaco, el Palacio Apostólico del Vaticano y hasta la Nunciatura (como una embajada) en Washington, DC. He orado en la cueva de la isla de Patmos donde el amado discípulo, San Juan, recibió la visión del Libro del Apocalipsis. He rezado invocaciones en cenas, banquetes, servicios ecuménicos, reuniones del Concejo Municipal y de los Comisionados del Condado, e incluso en un juego de la NFL. Participé en un exorcismo en México, que fue bastante impactante para mí. He bautizado a miles y oficiado cientos de bodas y funerales y he dado bendiciones a parejas en aniversarios de todas las edades: ¡25, 40, 50, 60 e incluso 70 años! He rezado el Rosario con feligreses en muchas parroquias, con religiosas, con niños, con

un santo (JPII). Como sacerdote, he estado en montañas, playas y selvas, en lo alto de torres y cúpulas de iglesias, y he bajado a catacumbas y criptas subterráneas. Una vez recé la Liturgia de las Horas en la cima de una pirámide maya en México que una vez había sido un lugar de sacrificios humanos al sol. He estado en un gran número de hospitales, hogares de ancianos, unidades de cuidados paliativos, cementerios e incluso en algunas morgues para recibir sacramentos y bendiciones. He estado en las tumbas de varios santos, incluyendo la de San Junípero Serra en el Carmelo, San Andrés en Montreal, Santa Catalina Labouré, San Vicente de Paúl, San Pedro y San Pablo en Roma, y la de mi propio patrón, San Marcos, en Venecia. Estos años han sido bastante gratificantes.

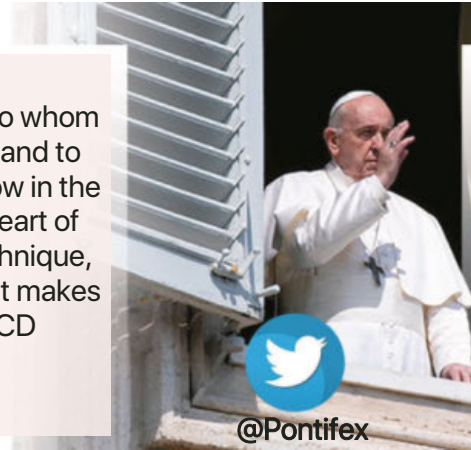

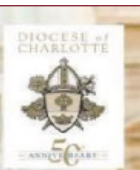

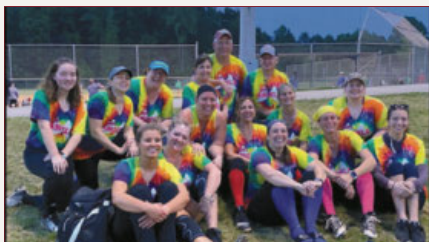

FRESH INK from our Director of Religious Education RESOLUTIONS by Kelli Olszewski

... as in New Year's resolutions. It is a new year which means new you. Adios 2021! Hola 2022!

However you wish to embrace it or fight it, 2022 has arrived.

The world of marketing convinces us that we need to change. And the reality of it is we do, but do our changes reflect the millions and millions of dollars spent on marketing and advertising campaigns that tell us not only what to change, but how to do it?

As we always spend the last few days of the year: spending hours in return lines at the stores, eating leftovers and too much desserts, we see everyone's "year in review" and we realize we need to "make changes" for the impending new year. Do we spend enough time discerning and praying what we need to change? I know time gets ahead of me and I forget.

As I was at the gym (prior to the new year), there were approximately 20 television screens above the treadmills, ellipticals, stair climbers, and rowing machines. As every advertisement came on one of the screens it was for a diet, athletic wear or at-home exercise equipment.

The last time I made a New Year's resolution was in 2011. Though God took me on a different path and redirected his plans for me, I completed my 2011 resolution eight years later – completing my master's degree. I didn't receive the degree I originally wanted to get (Masters in English Literature), God redirected how he wanted to use me – in ministry.

I do not recall most of my previous resolutions. Worse yet, I am more than certain I never accomplished any of my resolutions. After doing some research I found out a few things about resolutions and how they came to be.

Unfortunately, only eight percent of people accomplish their New Year's resolution and 80% give up by mid-February.

Yes, I have failed many times over the years.

Resolutions date back over 4,000 years to the Babylonians. They would celebrate their annual New Year aligned with their agricultural planting season during their pagan festival Akitu.

Their celebration included crowning a king and making promises to re-pay their debts.

If they succeeded, they believed the gods would show favor upon them.

A similar custom is also noted under the Roman Empire during the reign of Julius Caesar. Honoring the two-faced god, Janus, of which our Julian calendar and month of January derives from, they would make sacrifices and promises to the deity. For early Christians it became a traditional custom to reflect on one's mistakes during the past year "resolving" to make positive changes for the coming year.

Regardless of its religious roots, New Year's resolutions are now considered to be a secularized custom primarily focused on self-improvement. This made me think of previous years of attempting a resolution. They were more superficial in nature: losing weight to "look better" instead of focusing more on healthier living with better food choices and increased activity.

As I grew in my relationship with Jesus, I realized my better option for self-improvement is during Lent, a six-week period to increase and deepen one's spiritual life by focusing on Jesus. Prayer becomes a huge aspect of that desired change and sacrifice made. I have had more success making spiritual changes that far exceed society's definition of "self-improvement".

Though many aim to quit smoking, quit drinking, find a new job or lose weight, they are by far very important lifestyle changes, ones that still impact a person interiorly for his or her betterment. The whole point of the "resolution" is to resolve a problem or break bad habits, but they can be about developing good habits too. By developing good habits we become more virtuous, especially as it relates to developing and increasing our spiritual practices. The more we retain virtue the more holy we become which puts us on a remarkable journey to becoming a saint. If I ever attempt a New Year's resolution again, I know I cannot do it without the support of my faith and prayer. In the fabulous words of G.K. Chesterton, "The object of a new year is not that we should have a new year, but rather that we should have a new soul."

So I will see you around March 2, Ash Wednesday, as we begin our 2022 Lenten journey together. ■

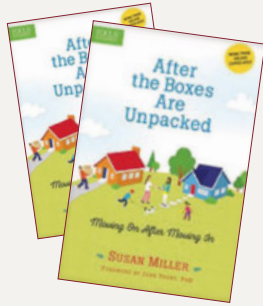

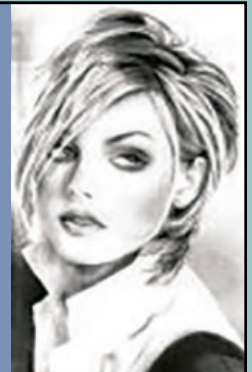
