# Fasting & Abstinence

Reminder that Good Friday, March 28th, is a day of Fast & Abstinences and for Catholics. In addition, all Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

**Fasting:** Ages 18-59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. No eating between meals.

**Abstinence:** Ages 14 & older-the law of abstinence requires Catholics to not eat meat on the Fridays in Lent once they have reached the age of 14.

## SACRAMENTS

### SACRAMENTS Baptism

The Infant Baptismal Preparation Process assists parents with newborns through age 6 to understand the basic theology of the Sacrament & realize the responsibilities that come with the baptism of their child. #### **First Communion**

#### Confirmation

Youth begin direct preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of their 8th grade year, but they must have been in Catholic Day School or PSR for AT LEAST one year prior. #### **Anointing of the Sick**

All parishioners who are seriously ill, advanced in years, or facing serious surgery are welcome to receive the Sacrament by contacting Fr. Steve or by attending a communal anointing service, held twice per year. Children are to be anointed if they have the sufficient use of reason (age 7) to be strengthened by this Sacrament.
