FROM FR. STEVE....

Happy "Big Game" Sunday! Remember, our Men's Group, Cor, is hosting a party at 5PM. All are welcome! This event is being sponsored by our Knights of Columbus and Saint Justin Martyr's Holy Name Society. Elvis Grbac is the guest speaker. It should be a wonderful event. I must admit I am not excited about the game. I was hoping for the Browns or a team that hasn't won or been there. But, I am glad the Ravens didn't make it. I hope you enjoy the day. Monday, February 3rd was the feast of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. Also, on that day, you have the option to celebrate the feast of Saint Ansgar. If you took a church calendar, you may have noticed his name along with Saint Blaise. I always celebrate Saint Blaise because of the tradition of the blessing of throats on his feast. But I thought I would take this opportunity to share about Saint Ansgar. Saint Ansgar lived in the 9th Century. He is known as the "Apostle to the North." Saint Ansgar grew up in France. When he was five years old, his mother died. His father then sent him to a Benedictine Monastery for an education. Five-year-olds must have been very tough back then. I can't imagine losing your mom at that age and then being sent to a monastery. I read that he did not take his faith or studies seriously at first. One night he had a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary coming to him with other moms behind her and one was his mother! Our Lady asked St. Ansgar if he wanted to be with his mother one day in heaven. After he responded, "yes!" The Blessed Virgin told him he must turn away from his childish ways. Saint Ansgar turned his life around, but he started to slip as a teenager. Then he had another vision. This one was about purgatory, and it got him back on track. At age 21 he become a Benedictine Monk and was sent to do missionary work in Germany. Eventually, Saint Ansgar made his way up North into Denmark and then into Sweden. When Saint Ansgar became a bishop in Northern Germany, he sent missionaries to Denmark, Norway and Sweden. As a bishop he worked tirelessly to evangelize. He built Churches, schools, monasteries and hospitals. Saint Ansgar was very good to the poor. He did not have it easy as a bishop. Saint Ansgar's life was threatened by Vikings and non-believers. Some of his churches were confiscated and destroyed due to the ravages of war. He lived a simple, prayerful life and fasted often. Even though Saint Ansgar desired martyrdom he made many sacrifices in the work of evangelization. He is the patron of Scandinavia and canonized a saint in 865 by Pope Nicholas I. So, now you know a little about the saint that shares a day with St. Blaise. God bless and have a great week!



The Holy Face Chaplet

In our Blessed Mother's own words, the medal is a weapon for defense, a shield for courage, and a token of love and mercy which her Divine Son wished to give the world in these troubled days of lust and hatred for God and His Church.

Whoever wears this medal and, if possible, pays a weekly visit to the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesday in a spirit of reparation for the outrages received by the Holy Face of our Blessed Savior during His passion and those bestowed on Him every day in the Sacrament of His Divine Love, will be granted the gift of a strong faith and the grace to fly to its defense, conquering, if need be, all interior and exterior difficulties. Moreover, they are promised a happy death

with special assistance from Christ Himself. The very first Holy Face medal was offered to our glorious Pontiff, Pope Pius XII.

The whole world then got acquainted with this special object of favors and devotion. It has been found on land and sea, and never has it been heard that a prisoner of war wearing this badge of salvation has been executed.

Our Blessed Lord also requested that a special feast be instituted to honor His Holy Face on Shrove Tuesday - the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday.

This year, Shrove Tuesday / Mardi Gras, falls on Tuesday, March 4th, 2025.

SACRAMENTS Baptism

The Infant Baptismal Preparation Process assists parents with newborns through age 6 to understand the basic theology of the Sacrament & realize the responsibilities that come with the baptism of their child. If you are interested please contact the Parish Office. Children between the ages of 7 & 17 who are interested in being welcomed into the Roman Catholic faith should contact the parish office ~ 440-943-2133.

First Communion

Children between the ages of 7 & 17 who would like to receive First Holy Communion must participate in preparation classes. For more information, contact Fr. Steve Breck at 440-943-2133.

Confirmation

Youth begin direct preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of their 8th grade year, but they must have been in Catholic Day School or PSR for AT LEAST one year prior. Marriage

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a preparation time of at least six months. Please contact Fr. Breck for information.

Anointing of the Sick

All parishioners who are seriously ill, advanced in years, or facing serious surgery are welcome to receive the Sacrament by contacting Fr. Steve or by attending a communal anointing service, held twice per year. Children are to be anointed if they have the sufficient use of reason (age 7) to be strengthened by this Sacrament.
