



FROM FR. STEVE....

Happy Second Week of Lent! I hope you received our mailer. In the mailer, there is a calendar of events for Lent. But I hope you take the time to read about the new changes for our festival. I hope you like the changes and additions. Plus, I hope you support our Festival Raffle and volunteer to help. We need you! Again, thank you for all your support. I think our Art & Environment are doing a great job. I like the Lenten Decorations. They are packed with meaning. According to Liz Annandono and the team, the design for the Lenten season was based on the concept of desolation and confusion. According to the committee, "It's what the followers of Jesus must have felt once he was taken away from them to face torture and death. All for the love of us." The burlap is a nice touch. Art & Environment wondered, "Do you trim it up or let it shred apart?" Liz added, "Even though it made us feel uneasy, we decided it was symbolic to leave it alone. Let it fray and shred. But why did it bother us in the first place? We wanted to tidy it up, make it look nicer. On retrospect, I'm thinking that the followers of Jesus wanted to tidy things up too. What was happening to this amazing person? They loved Jesus and believed in his teachings but now he was being taken away. They wanted to fix it because everything was "unraveling" just as easily as the burlap unravels. Ultimately Jesus was the only one who could fix it. He chose to let things unravel. So now the burlap takes on another meaning and symbolizes this feeling. Sometimes you need to feel uncomfortable to change. That is what Lent is calling us to do. The burlap is your reminder." They said that the Gathering Area features the crown of thorns and the nails that are waiting for Jesus. They added, "As you walk into church vou automatically know what season vou're in. Symbols that are clearly reminding you that Lent has begun. Then you see the subdued colors on the altar. The colors of sandy burlap and the gray of a dreary day invite you to be quiet, relax, pray and meditate. The crown reminds you again of what's to come. The big rock in front of the ambo can illustrate two symbols. Is it the rock Jesus leaned on during the Passion, or is it a rock used to close the tomb where Jesus was laid to rest? It will come back at Easter as a rock in the garden where Jesus revealed himself to Mary Magdalene. All of the designs use burlap, rocks, stones and succulents to remind you of the desert where Jesus and his disciples walked. The empty vases symbolize that we empty ourselves at the beginning of Lent only to be filled with renewed faith and love for Jesus." Thank you, Art & Environment. God bless!

Grief, as we know, is the experience of coping with loss, and it can accompany various life events that disrupt our sense of normalcy. Many factors can bring on grief—Loss of a job, Death of a loved one, Broken relationships, Death of a pet, Divorce, or any significant change in your life. Everyone's experience of grief is different; there is no one-size-fits-all. Grief that follows these losses is natural and very normal. However, sometimes our own reactions are unexpected. Support groups can provide guidance to help find our way and navigate through the transition.

A new six consecutive week; support group program is being offered at Immaculate Conception-Willoughby for anyone who has experienced a loss. We encourage you to join us each week and learn about various symptoms of grief, what you might experience and ways that could help you navigate through difficult days.

Sessions begin on Sunday March 30th and run through Sunday May 11th.





### **Baptism**

The Infant Baptismal Preparation Process assists parents with newborns through age 6 to understand the basic theology of the Sacrament & realize the responsibilities that come with the baptism of their child. If you are interested please contact the Parish Office. Children between the ages of 7 & 17 who are interested in being welcomed into the Roman Catholic faith should contact the parish office ~ 440-943-2133.

#### **First Communion**

Children between the ages of 7 & 17 who would like to receive First Holy Communion must participate in preparation classes. For more information, contact Fr. Steve Breck at 440-943-2133.

#### **Confirmation**

Youth begin direct preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of their 8th grade year, but they must have been in Catholic Day School or PSR for AT LEAST one year prior.
