

Please know our parish office will be closed on Dyngus Day, Easter Monday, April 21st! Morning Mass on the 21st will be at 9AM. Thank you Art & Environment for doing such a beautiful job decorating the Church for Holy Week and Easter. According to Liz and the Art & Environment Committee, "The Easter design is totally symbolic of the relief that Jesus still lives! He has redeemed us! The main colors are white which again symbolizes the purity of Jesus, but a soft yellow brings in the beauty of a warm summer day. Again, relief is symbolic of how we feel going from winter to spring. You'll be greeted upon entering the church with the fragrance of flowers in bloom!" ## SACRAMENTS

#### SACRAMENTS Baptism

The Infant Baptismal Preparation Process assists parents with newborns through age 6 to understand the basic theology of the Sacrament & realize the responsibilities that come with the baptism of their child. If you are interested please contact the Parish Office. Children between the ages of 7 & 17 who are interested in being welcomed into the Roman Catholic faith should contact the parish office ~ 440-943-2133.

#### **First Communion**

Children between the ages of 7 & 17 who would like to receive First Holy Communion must participate in preparation classes. For more information, contact Fr. Steve Breck at 440-943-2133.

#### Confirmation

Youth begin direct preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of their 8th grade year, but they must have been in Catholic Day School or PSR for AT LEAST one year prior. #### Marriage

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a preparation time of at least six months. Please contact Fr. Breck for information.

#### **Anointing of the Sick**

All parishioners who are seriously ill, advanced in years, or facing serious surgery are welcome to receive the Sacrament by contacting Fr. Steve or by attending a communal anointing service, held twice per year. Children are to be anointed if they have the sufficient use of reason (age 7) to be strengthened by this Sacrament.
