

## Thoughts from our Religious Ed Director

At least from my experience, being a parent is a constant learning experience. Just when you feel like you conqueror one life lesson, like how to safely install a car seat, it is on the to next, such as potty training. Even lessons you thought you mastered in elementary school come back to you from your kids, like "Mom, what is a preposition?" or "why is 'sugar' not spelled 'shugar'?" And math – all math.

But in thinking about new ways to explain a lesson to a young person, we ourselves grow. In no area is this more important than in matters of faith. My kids challenge me, regularly, with questions about the Mass, the Bible, religious artwork, and all matters of faith. And I know I am not alone.

Between last week and this Sunday, 18 young members of our parish will make their First Communions, with another young man preparing to receive his First Communion in June. And, in a few weeks, 22 of our 8<sup>th</sup> graders will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Zubik. They did not get to this point alone, but through the efforts of parents, Catechists, and a worshiping parish community. As such, this is a day of celebration for all of us!

Every year first communion is such an exciting time, with this year being especially exciting for me as my sweet middle child, Brigi, will be receiving her first communion this weekend! Like so many of our first communicants, she has been waiting for this day, eagerly anticipating the moment she too could receive. At home, she has been practicing how to hold her hands, when to bow, and what to say.

But, this parish community has been teaching her, and all of our first communicants, how to live the Eucharist. The mechanics of how we reverently receive are important, but of infinitely greater importance is how we take this spiritual food and allow it to nourish our lives of faith and service. Since my kids were very young, parishioners have thanked them for being at Mass, asked them to help carry flowers to the sanctuary or decorate a Christmas tree near the altar. Fr. Adam has asked my kids (and all of the first communicants) to be servers – reminding them that their presence and their desire to help at Mass matters. And it does matter.

When we were in college my friend Ruthann, a fellow Theology major and also my daughter Brigi's Godmother, would always say that young people are not the future of the church – they are the church! I try to share this lesson with our Confirmation students, that we need their gifts – their joy and energy, their ideas and compassionate hearts. We need our college students and young adults to share their creativity and new perspectives. We need the young families with the crying babies at Mass, to make the church feel alive! We need our working professionals, to share their time, energy, and specific skill sets with the various needs of the parish. We are so grateful for the, often retired, members of our community, who so generously count money on Thursdays or help with mailings, and who comprise a large portion of sewing ministry (who always putting forth effort to make special pillow cases as gifts for our kids to celebrate their First Communion.) We are also so deeply grateful for the homebound members of our community who lift us all up with their prayers. At all of life's stages – we are the church!

There are certain moments in the Gospels where we read about Jesus addressing someone in front of him, but it feels like Jesus is directing these imperative sentences right to us today. "Be not Afraid." "Go, and sin no more." "Do this in remembrance of me." And today's directive, "Feed my sheep." From the great gift of the Eucharist, to sharing spiritual or uplifting words, to those who volunteer in Food Banks, at the Fish Fry, or Funeral dinners, we know that the Church feeds us in so many ways, and asks us to Feed others. How are you fed? How do you feed others?
