

### Thoughts from Fr. Sean

Last night I was watching the news when a story came up about the possibility of Roe V. Wade being overturned. I can't remember what station the story was on but it was framed within the context of "women's reproductive rights are in jeopardy". While I agree that women are victims, I suspect they aren't quite victims in the way the news anchors were presenting it. Rather than simply giving my opinion I would prefer to bring up an event that happened years ago that highlights how the "right to choose" leaves at least two victims in its wake. For the sake of anonymity I'm going to change the name of the primary individual.

Pam had met the love of her life and after dating for a number of years they married and started planning for a family. When they started trying they found getting pregnant wasn't as easy as they thought it would be. Months turned into 10 years when Pam faced the reality she may never get pregnant. In her disappointed state Pam opened up to a friend at her church. She revealed she didn't think she'd ever become pregnant because when she and her husband were engaged, she became unintentionally pregnant and ended up having an abortion, without telling him. At the time it seemed to her the right thing to do as they didn't have much money and she was planning a wedding and was not at all prepared to bring a child into the world—not yet, anyway. She admitted to her friend that after the abortion she thought about the baby a lot; how old he/she would be, who they would have looked like. At Christmas and Eastertime, there was the empty space where that child should be. She also thought about what gifts the child had and it hit her years later that God had a plan for that child, even if she didn't. Now, after being married for 10 years with no luck in getting pregnant, she worried this was some sort of punishment for her decision.

Pam's friend was consoling and comforting but was admittingly shocked that she came to such a negative conclusion about God and about the connection she was making about not being able to become pregnant. God doesn't operate like that. He doesn't punish someone for some past sin. Her friend said that she should still try to become pregnant, but because she's carried this secret for so many years perhaps she really does need healing. Pam opened up to her husband about what she had done. He was comforting and understanding but was also surprised by her conclusion (that she couldn't become pregnant due to some kind of a punishment for her previous sin). At the advice of her friend she became part of Rachel's Vineyard, which is Christian organization started by Catholic priests that helps women who've had abortions heal and learn to forgive themselves. She went to a weekend retreat with her husband and was able to mourn the loss of her child. During the retreat she also juxtaposed the love and care the retreat planners had for the women against the women in the abortion clinic who guided her through that process; they didn't warn her about the feelings she would have later and they didn't follow up to see how she was doing. The lack of concern afterwards always made her feel as though she was just another number, just a way to make a profit. Approximately one year following the retreat Pam gave birth to twin boys. Eleven months after that she gave birth to a baby girl. While God was not "punishing her" for her abortion years earlier Pam did need deep internal healing that allowed her to internalize the joy he always wanted to give her as well as the joy of what motherhood was all about.

The point of this story is to demonstrate that while the pro-choice side certainly displays passion at demonstrations, it acts as if the procedure ends once the woman leaves the clinic. They turn a blind eye to the very real fallout that so many women face for years afterward. Fallout I can attest to from decades of hearing confessions in which so many heartbroken women lament their decision and find themselves struggling to move on. "It was supposed to be easy," they say, and "it was supposed to be the responsible decision." But they find themselves spending years trying to put something back together, trying to fix what is broken, retrieve what was lost. I believe their struggle comes from the realization they were lied to and it wasn't just a fetus after all; it was a child – their child – and it's a knowledge they carry in the depth of their soul.


Festival Ground Prep Work Saturday May 21st, 2022 9:00am till ???
