Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 20, 2021

We hear in our first reading from the Book of Job. To better understand the Book of Job and today's reading, it is helpful to know what the Book of Job is about and why it was written. The story that frames the book is a folk tale about a holy man named Job who is tormented by a series of terrible personal losses (Job 1:1-2:13) but who is mercifully restored to well-being in the end (Job 42:7-17). In between the main character, Job is described as carrying on a series of conversations- perhaps "debates" is a better term- with his friends over the cause of his suffering. His friends recite all of the standard of explanations for why bad things happen to people, while Job defends his innocence. Finally, God appears on the scene and confronts Job in two speeches (Job 38:2-39:25 and 40:6-41:26). Today's reading is taken from the first part of the first speech, in which God questions Job about whether he understands God's "counsel."

The reading is a theophany, a self-revelation of God. Job hears the voice of God from within a storm wind. God leads Job into a deeper appreciation of certain aspects of God's own self. These questions also enable Job to look beyond the natural world he knows and to consider the forces of nature in a new way.

The questions themselves are more rhetorical than they are requests for answers. God asks questions about the primordial events of creation and the order within the universe that resulted from these events. Throughout this interrogation, there is one fundamental question: Who did it, or who is the creator? There is no doubt in anyone's mind that the creator of this well-working universe is the very one who is posing the questions.

Job may not have been present at God's cosmological victory, but he is certainly able to appreciate the order that was born of it. He would have known violent storms and the clouds and darkness that were part of it. If he never realized it before, this theophany questioning by God would have helped him realize that regardless of the fury of the storm and the danger it might pose for people God still had control over the elements of the universe.

Our Gospel reading is from Mark. Most of the miracles of Jesus are either healing or exorcism. This one is clearly a nature miracle, though it does contain a feature that resembles an exorcism. Jesus rebukes the powers of the storm as one would rebuke a demon. After a long day with the crowds Jesus and his disciples are on the shore of the lake. From there they enter into a boat to go over to the other side. The stage is set for the miracle.

The disciples themselves act toward Jesus in several different ways in this short passage. At the outset they are concerned with his well-being. They whisk him away from the crowds and allow him to sleep in the stern of the boat as they try to maneuver it across the sea. When the boat begins to fill with water, they run to him for help, believing that he is able to save them from harm. However, their words indicate that they are not confident that he will. This is the lack of faith that Jesus challenges. Finally, after they witness his remarkable authority, they are in awe of him, wondering what manner of man he might be.

The question with which the episode ends captures the gist of the account. Who is this man? By what authority does he act? This is not an idle query. It is really the fundamental question raised by the ministry of Jesus. The force of his teaching and the miraculous character of his deeds were not denied. What was questioned was the origin of the power that he exercised. This was doubly an issue because Jesus did not invoke the power of God before he spoke or acted; he simply spoke or acted and left to those around him to decide about him for themselves.

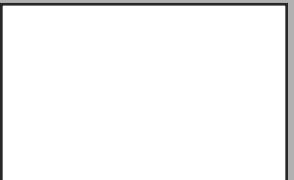
