#### THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME—JAN. 23, 2022

#### Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 23, 2022

On this third Sunday we have this beautiful first reading taken from the Book of Nehemiah. The time was when the Jewish community returned from the Babylonian Exile. Ezra was the priest who acted as religious leader of the Jewish community at that time. Nehemiah was the one who had led people back and who then supervised the rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem. Both these men had been authorized by the Persian authorities. The scene described in the first reading for today depicts an official religious assembly led by Ezra wherein the people commit themselves to the law.

The account contains a significant amount of ritual language and action, indicating its liturgical character. Ezra is acting in his capacity as priest, one who is responsible for interpreting the law. The assembly is unusually inclusive, embracing not only the men but the women and children as well. The author of the account makes a point of the need for the children to understand the gravity of the occasion. This is not merely a communal gathering. Those who participate take upon themselves the serious obligation of observance of the law. As Ezra opens the scroll, the people stand in respect for the words they are about to hear. Ezra blesses the Lord, and the people raise their hands in a common expression of prayer, responding in affirmation: "Amen, amen!" They then prostrate themselves in reverence. All of this is in preparation for the reading. The ritual takes place in an open square in front of the northeastern part of the city wall known as the Water Gate. It was so named because it was opposite the Gihon Spring.

The reading itself takes about six or seven hours, from daybreak to midday. What was read is not specified, but the manner in which it was read is described. Interpretation was provided along with the reading because the community, made up of descendants of those who had been taken into exile, may not have understood the Hebrew in which the law was written. Perhaps the instructions had to offer a significant amount of translation or try to make relevant in new ways the requirements of a tradition that originated in the past. Such interpretation is always a challenge for a believing community. The law itself was probably not entirely new to them, but a contemporary way of living it would be. Ezra and those with him hand down the tradition they have received. Thus, the people can accept it as their own and can identify with events and communities of the past.

Their response to this instructive reading is curious- they weep. The assembly itself was intended to be a joyous one, but the people weep. Perhaps they do so out of remorse for infidelity or because they are overcome by the grandeur of the sacred event. Whatever the reason, they are told to rejoice, to participate in a festive meal.

The Gospel reading begins with an address to Theophilus, whose name means "friend or lover of God." The respect the author accords this man suggests he is the patron who had assumed the responsibility of publishing this writing (Acts 1:1). Here the author says some very interesting things about this gospel. It was one among the several accounts of the events in the life of Jesus. It follows an orderly, presumably chronological, sequence. The events themselves are said to have fulfilled either the promises made by God or the expectations of the people that grew out of those promises. While the authenticity of the other accounts is based on the word of eyewitnesses who were also ministers of the word, this account is an interpretation of what was handed down by others. The author explicitly admits he is not an eyewitness by stating that word was handed down "to us." "Handing down" is the technical word for passing on authoritative tradition. Theophilus is here assured of authenticity of the instruction in the faith he had received. The eyewitnesses handed down the tradition to Luke, and now Luke hands it down to his patron.

The primary theme that comes through the readings for this Sunday is the word of God. Just as the Christmas season was the time to celebrate the incarnation of the Word of God in human form, so this weekend we reflect on the proclamation of the word of God as found in religious traditions that are handed down.
