

Ask Father

Question: Where in the Old Testament is the promise of the messiah first mentioned?

Answer: Genesis 3:14-15: "And the Lord God said to the serpent: 'Because you have done this, Accursed be you of all animals wild and tame! On your belly you will go and on dust you will feed as long as you live. I shall put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; it will bruise your head and you will strike its heel.""

Immediately following the Fall, God condemns Satan for his actions and promises that the offspring of the New Eve - Christ - will crush the head of Satan. In the Vulgate the "it" was "ipsa" so in some translations it is translated as "her" but the meaning is the same since it was read in the sense of the New Eve's offspring, i.e Mary's Son, Our Lord Jesus.





THE TWENY-NINTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The Lord be with you. We have come to the end of our investigation of the Beatitudes and our analysis of Confirmation. The Holy Spirit gives us the aid we need to live out Christ's life here on earth so that we can have its fullness in Heaven.

Question 715. Who may be rightly called merciful?

Answer. The merciful are they who practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and who aid by word or deed those who need their help for soul or body.

Question 716. Why are the clean of heart promised so great a reward?

Answer. The clean of heart, that is, the truly virtuous, whose thoughts, desires, words and works are pure and modest, are promised so great a reward because the chaste and sinless have always been the most intimate friends of God.

Question 717. What is the duty of a peacemaker?

Answer. It is the duty of a peacemaker to avoid and prevent quarrels, reconcile enemies, and to put an end to all evil reports of others or evil speaking against them. As peacemakers are called the children of God, disturbers of peace should be called the children of the devil.

Question 718. Why does Our Lord speak in particular of poverty, meekness, sorrow, desire for virtue, mercy, purity, peace and suffering?

Answer. Our Lord speaks in particular of poverty, meekness, sorrow, desire for virtue, mercy, purity, peace and suffering because these are the chief features in His own earthly life; poverty in His birth, life and death; meekness in His teaching; sorrow at all times. He eagerly sought to do good, showed mercy to all, recommended chastity, brought peace, and patiently endured suffering.

Question 719. Which are the twelve fruits of the Holy Ghost?

Answer. The twelve fruits of the Holy Ghost are Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Benignity, Goodness, Long-suffering, Mildness, Faith, Modesty, Continency, and Chastity.

Question 720. Why are charity, joy, peace, etc., called fruits of the Holy Ghost?

Answer. Charity, joy, peace, etc., are called fruits of the Holy Ghost because they grow in our souls out of the seven gifts of the Holy Ghost.

My commentary.

Whereas Questions 715-717 go over some the remaining Beatitudes, Questions 719 and 720 bring up the fruits of the Holy Spirit. Our first three question address what it means to be merciful, clean of heart, and a peacemaker. Of those three, it is only Question 716 that needs further explanation. Why are the chaste and sinless are the most intimate friends of God? Since sin divides us from God, those who lack sin have the least distance from God. God, always desiring more intimacy with us, makes those open to His grace full of it. Ergo, those without sin - the clean of heart - will find themselves growing ever closer to God and becoming ever more His friends.

Lastly, we have the fruits of the Holy Spirit. We distinguish the fruits from the gifts insofar as the fruits come from the gifts. Moreover, the fruits are mostly for the receipt whereas the gifts are for the Church and her mission. Take joy and peace for example. We cannot share joy and peace with others because they are innate to our souls. We can share counsel and knowledge, but we can only invite others to grow in love so that they can grow in joy. I would only add

that knowing about the fruits helps us to understand that certain effects of grace only slowly build up in our souls. Too often we want God to change us immediately; instead, grace usually develops slowly within us.

Our long discussion of Confirmation has gone over how this sacrament enable us to more deeply experience the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. The more we know what God can do, the more we can ask from Him and the more we can direct our wills towards His Will. At each point in our lives, there are certain human virtues and certain effects of grace that we need more than others. May we always have the wisdom to be seeking what God intends for us next.
