

# The More You Know... Theological Musings

- with Maripat Grant-

Already, and not yet...

This phrase represents a theological concept about the Kingdom of God.

The word "Already" refers to the Kingdom of God being in the here and now. We are living in it.

"Not yet" reminds us that we are awaiting the next age (of the Kingdom of God) which is still to come.

Through Jesus' birth, God the Son came to us. As us. He didn't have to become incarnate or be crucified to save us. Yet He did. He knew that doing this was the best way to save us from ourselves. And because of this great gift to humanity, we celebrate His 'birth' day.

If this blessed event hadn't happened in a human way at the time it did, we likely would not truly understand our own Salvation History.

That is why God sent us His Son. To save us. He taught us that although we sin, we can be forgiven and be in communion with God.

We are 'already' in the middle of our salvation process. However, during Advent, we hear in the Gospels and Fr. Tom's homilies that the Son of Man will return in the last days. We also hear that message at every mass all year long when the presider says "We wait in joyful hope of the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ" during the Lord's Prayer. Are you ready? I know I'm not, but I hope to be. "Not Yet." But it IS coming.

Lent and Advent have much in common. (Besides the color purple.) They are both penitential seasons in our liturgical calendar. We need to look at our own lives and strive to be better. That's hard to do sometimes.

When I felt the 'struggles' of difficult things in my life, my grandmother would always say to me, "offer it up." She meant 'for the souls in purgatory,' but why not do this for those that are hurting and need help in the here and now?

So because of this, when I am feeling down about something, I 'offer it up.' I 'give it to God,' and in exchange, try to make someone smile by my words or actions.

As Grama would also say, "someone always has it worse."

I try to do a little more of this practice during these seasons. Not just because my grandmother said to, but because God sent us His Son to show us how truly important that is.

As a Music Director, hymns are always on my mind. I'll close with important words from Hark, the Herald Angels Sing that I think touches on this concept of redemption and addresses both the "already" and the "not yet."

Hark! The herald angels sing "Glory to the newborn King" Peace on earth and mercy mild God and sinners reconciled."





As is common with older Saints and Martyrs of the Church, not much is known and often what is known is based on rumors. However, there always appears to be a bit of truth in between the stories.

St. Lucy was born to a noble Greek family and was raised as a Christian by her mother in Syracuse, Sicily. One story that has been pretty consistent, is that of St. Lucy remaining a virgin and dedicating her life to helping those less fortunate. As the story develops, a suitor that had been selected by her mother became very insulted that she did not return his affections and was spending her dowry to help the poor.

The suitor reported Lucy as a Christian which was a crime against the city at that time. It has been suggested the Holy

Spirit entered Lucy and helped her to stand against all tortures being done to her. Supposedly, heated pitch and resin was poured on her, wood stacked in bundles to burn her and the guards ordered to gouge out her eyes. Another version was her placed with the prostitutes of the day so she would become like them. The fire, pitch and resin and humiliations did not harm her. However, she could not see, hence, the reason for being the Patron Saint of the blind and eye troubles and ailments. At the end of it all, she was stabbed with a dagger through the throat which did succeed in killing her. When she was prepared for burial, it was noted that her eyes had been miraculously restored.

Often during the Middle Ages she was prayed to and her name invoked to intercede and help people who were having eye troubles. Lucy in Italian means light and her reference to eye sight and being able to see, is her legacy to everyone. Below are links for further reading.

# Saint Lucy's Prayer:

Saint Lucy, you did not hide your light under a basket, but let it shine for the whole world, for all the centuries to see. We may not suffer torture in our lives the way you did, but we are still called to let the light of our Christianity illumine our daily lives. Please help us to have the courage to bring our Christianity into our work, our recreation, our relationships, our conversation -- every corner of our day. Amen




