A MESSAGE FROM OUR DEACON

Have you ever had the experience of misplacing your keys, your hat, or your purse/wallet, and praying to Saint Anthony for help with finding it? If so, you're not alone and, if not, you might want to consider it! Saint Anthony was born in Lisbon, Portugal, at the end of the eleventh century. He became a Franciscan priest and a theology teacher for his order, at the request of Saint Francis of Assisi himself. He was also well known for delivering inspiring and insightful sermons that were eventually published. Later, in 1946, he would be named as a Doctor of the Church for his preaching and writing.

Saint Anthony once had a novice in the seminary that walked off with his Book of Psalms, hand written and filled with notes in the margins, when the novice decided to leave the formation process. He prayed for the finding or returning of that book that was so valuable to him. Eventually, the seminarian came back, gave the book to Saint Anthony, and even rejoined the community in the seminary. This is the reason why, to this day, Saint Anthony is the Patron Saint of Lost Articles. I can't tell you how many things I have lost but then found over the years through the intercession of Saint Anthony. He died at the young age of 35 in Padua, Italy, where he is entombed at the Basilica of Saint Anthony. He is usually referred to Saint Anthony of Padua, because this is where he died and is buried.

During the summer, as we move back into Ordinary Time, you might consider marking your Liturgical Year with the celebration of the feasts of the great saints. It seems like almost every day, we are celebrating someone who made a significant contribution to the faith and has been canonized as a saint. This past Friday, we remembered Saint Barnabas, a companion traveler with Saint Paul. Next week, we celebrate the Memorial of Saint Aloysius on June 21 and Saint Thomas More on June 22—two very important feasts here in Bowling Green. Then, on June 24, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. The list goes on, but the point here is that feast days marking the saints and events give us an opportunity to recall the history of the Catholic Church and those who came before us.

In the Domestic Church of your home, you might consider placing a picture of a painting of a saint in the living room. Take some time to pull up information about the saint Online by visiting a site such as catholic.org/saints. Read the stories of the saints with your spouses and children and ask the saints for their intercession as you go about the difficulties and successes of your life. You might even consider looking up a particular food item to prepare on a saint's feast day. For example, serve an Italian dish on the Feast of Saint Anthony or British fish and chips on the Feast of Saint Thomas More, just as it is tradition to serve an Irish meal of corned beef and cabbage on the Feast of Saint Patrick. In this way, you can have some fun, while making the saints come alive in your world as you continue to remember and imitate their faith.

Today, Saint Paul reminds us that "we walk by faith and not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). Thanks to the faith of those who came before us, we can "see" God in action and reflect on how the saints continue to influence us to this day. May Jesus and the Communion of Saints bless you today and throughout the summer months.



IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE

In 1993, my first ever anti-euthanasia column warned in Newsweek that once euthanasia became accepted widely, it would be followed by organ harvesting "as a plum to society."

Now, organ harvesting after euthanasia has become so normalized within the medical intelligentsea, that an American Medical Association publication, JAMA Surgery, had a letter debate – not about the propriety of killing and harvesting, but about whether the kill should begin at home or in a hospital. Two doctors say that "organ donation after euthanasia starting at home" (ODEH) is the way to go. Their debaters say, no, start the homicides in the hospital. No one says – don't do it! But I will.

Some of these patients (in Belgium and Netherlands) are not physically sick, but mentally ill. Believing that their deaths are more valuable than their lives – because of the lives potentially saved by their organs – could easily become the tipping point for some of these anguished patients to decide to be killed. In other words, organ donation could be an inducement to euthanasia. This could also be true for disabled patients.
