#### FROM OUR PASTOR

On Sunday we have a common assembly of all our members, whether they live in the city or the outlying districts. The recollections of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read, as long as there is time. When the reader has finished, the president of the assembly speaks to us; he urges everyone to imitate the examples of virtue we have heard in the readings. Then we all stand up together and pray.

On the conclusion of our prayer, bread and wine and water are brought forward. The president offers prayers and gives thanks [offers a Eucharistic prayer] to the best of his ability, and the people give assent by saying, "Amen". The Eucharist is distributed, everyone present communicates, and the deacons take it to those who are absent.

No one may share the Eucharist with us unless he believes that what we teach is true, unless he is washed in the regenerating waters of baptism for the remission of his sins, and unless he lives in accordance with the principles given us by Christ.

We do not consume the Eucharistic bread and wine as if it were ordinary food and drink, for we have been taught that as Jesus Christ our Savior became a man of flesh and blood by the power of the Word of God, so also the food that our flesh and blood assimilates for its nourishment becomes the flesh and blood of the incarnate Jesus by the power of his own words contained in the prayer of thanksgiving [Eucharistic prayer].

The apostles, in their recollections, which are called gospels, handed down to us what Jesus commanded them to do. They tell us that he took bread, gave thanks and said: Do this in memory of me. This is my body. In the same way he took the cup, he gave thanks and said: This is my blood. The Lord gave this command to them alone.

Ever since then we have constantly reminded one another of these things. The rich among us help the poor and we are always united. For all that we receive we praise the Creator of the universe through his Son Jesus Christ and through the Holy Spirit.

Lord Jesus Christ, you gave us the Eucharist as the memorial of your suffering and death. May our worship of this Sacrament of your Body and Blood help us to experience the salvation you won for us and the peace of the Kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.



#### IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE

Twenty-seven years ago, Marcus Mosley was born prematurely at just 26 weeks. Last month, he graduated from the CUNY school of Medicine at City College of New York with plans to return to the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) as a doctor specializing in infant care.

"It was very frightening when he was born and they told me that he was in the NICU," Mosley's mother Pauline told Good Morning America. "The doctors just kept giving these different percentages of very slim chance of him being normal, like less than 10%. They kept saying 90%, he might not be able to see. Eighty to 90% he would have developmental delays. They didn't know."

But Marcus defied the odds and thrived. When he was 13 years old, his parents brought him back to the NICU where he had spent the first 40 days of his life. Mosley met Dr. Edmund LaGamma, the chief of neonatology. During high school, Mosley called LaGamma to ask about participating in a shadowing program over the summer. Marcus told GMA that shadowing in the NICU "really piqued and then solidified my interest in wanting to go into medicine."

From our Telesteath Counselor

This week's Gospel reminds us of what God can truly do with the gifts that we bring to Him.

When I reflect on this Gospel, I like to think of the person that brought the loaves and fish to share. With such a large number of people, his gift could have been perceived as insignificant and dismissed as a useless contribution. However, Christ took what the person brought to Him and performed miracles with it.

I think the lesson here is that Christ works with what we bring to Him. We may view ourselves as insignificant or our talents as unimportant. We can see needs in our community and dismiss the impact that our talents and skills will have on improving anything. It is easy to think that we need a significant amount of money, a degree in theology, or some saintly level of holiness to make a difference, but this is a lie.

We have many saints who serve as an example of how small and silent acts have an incredibly farreaching impact. No matter how small or insignificant we think we are, or our talents are, God will take them and make great things happen because they are offered. He will take our offering and change, develop, and perfect it.

We always have something important to contribute to the Body of Christ and no offering is too small, unimportant, or insignificant. If we continue to offer ourselves and our gifts to Christ, we will continue to be like the person in today's Gospel whose offering was loved by God and used to feed five thousand.


