

FROM OUR DEACON

One of the great joys of being Catholic is "living liturgically"--celebrating key dates in the Church Year as we experience the calendar year in our own lives. This weekend, the Church celebrates the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time but also remembers the Feast of Saint Thomas the Apostle on July 3. When I hear the name "Thomas," I can't help but to think of many Catholic examples of faith that are illustrated by individuals with that name.

Saint Thomas the Apostle is often dubbed as "doubting Thomas" because he questioned whether Jesus had truly risen from the dead when the other apostles reported that He had appeared to them. In the end, he encounters Jesus and acknowledges Him as "my Lord and my God," giving all of us hope as we often carry the weight of uncertainty and doubt in our own hearts.

More than a thousand years later, the Chancellor of England was named Archbishop of Canterbury in 1162 AD. Thomas Becket was the king's righthand man, and they had been friends for most of their lives. But Becket pushed back against Henry II and refused to bend the Church to the king's wishes. Eventually, Henry sent out four of his knights to kill Becket, and he was slain by the sword during Evening Prayer in the cathedral. Within less than three years, Saint Thomas Becket was canonized, who served as an example of how God moves the hearts of the faithful, even if it requires swimming against the tide of popular opinion.

In the thirteenth century, Saint Thomas Aquinas--known as the "Angelic Doctor"--would write some of the most famous books on Catholic philosophy that have ever been recorded. He was in Orvieto, Italy, when a Eucharistic miracle occurred on the altar at Mass and wrote the words to the famous hymns O Salutaris Hostia and Tantum Ergo, both of which are still used today at Eucharistic Adoration.

Our parish's patron saint, Saint Thomas More, was born in England in 1478 and was a statesman and lawyer, known for defending the faith through speech and writings. Like Saint Thomas Becket, he refused to side with King Henry VIII when he sought a divorce from his wife. In his anger, Henry beheaded Saint Thomas in 1535. Saint Thomas More is often remembered by the famous statement he uttered before his martyrdom, "I die the king's good servant but God's servant first." We just celebrated his Feast Day on June 22.

A more modern "Thomas" that many are familiar with in our parish is Thomas Merton—a Trappist monk who was born in France in 1915 and died suddenly by electrocution after presenting a talk at a conference in Bangkok, Thailand, in 1968. Merton was a prolific writer who is best known for the story of his conversion in his autobiography entitled The Seven Storey Mountain, published in 1948. His spiritual director and confessor once assured me that Merton will someday be canonized but "in due time."

The Catholic Church has 2,000 years of history and so many faith-filled examples to explore and to call upon to serve as intercessors. As we celebrate the Feast of Saint Thomas the Apostle, I would encourage you to take some time to research more deeply and reflect on the lives of some of the "other Thomases" of the Church. It is said that Saint Thomas the Apostle spread the faith in India, so maybe we can even use that as an excuse to enjoy some Indian food this week as we also celebrate the birthday of our nation's independence.





This morning (June 24) the Supreme Court of the United States issued its landmark opinion overturning Roe vs. Wade, holding that the Constitution does not confer a right to abortion. The significance of this decision cannot be understated: States will now have the authority to protect innocent preborn children, as well as their mothers, fathers and communities, from the tragedy of abortion.

Today is a day to pray and roll up our sleeves. This is just the beginning. This decision hasn't ended abortion in our nation but has sent the decision about abortion laws back to the states. There is still so much work to be done to protect human life at every stage, to walk with and support pregnant mothers throughout and beyond their pregnancy, to build a culture I which the dignity of the human person is upheld in every heart, relationship, and societal structure. We know that hearts and minds cannot be legislated.

Let's multiply our efforts to help mothers and fathers in need, to connect women facing difficult or unexpected pregnancies with local programs offering material, emotional and spiritual support, before and after birth; and to offer compassion and help to women suffering in the aftermath of abortion.
