


1999 1000 00 Increased Security at the Parish Beginning on the weekend of October 22/23: although we have had no incidents of threat or vandalism, we would like to begin taking some wise precautions. We will begin locking the door in the social distance seating area of the church after the collect (opening prayer). Therefore, those who arrive after that time will need to use the main entrance. Furthermore, one usher will sit in the very back near the doors of the church to keep an eye on everyone who attempts to enter.

A Small Change Regarding the Book of Prayer Intentions & Bulletins: It has been the custom to send the book of prayer intentions forward with the bread and wine at the preparation of the gifts (this used to be called the offertory). The problem is that there is no good place to put the book. Therefore, we will begin leaving the book on the table at the back of the church. We always pray for the various intentions of the parish at each Holy Mass, and God knows what those are. Bulletins will be given out at the end of Holy Mass (they will be set out before that time in case some people have a real need to leave early so that they can grab one). Therefore, bulletins will not be available before Holy Mass. We want the bulletin to be taken home and not left in the pew, as sometimes happens. This change will begin on the weekend of October 22/23.

Need Church Envelopes? Just call Paul in the Church Office 334-365-8680. **Some Principles of Tithing**: The word "tithe" originally meant ten percent (10%). The "tithe," however, is only a guideline to help determine one's sacrificial giving. Some can offer more than a 10% tithe; others may have circumstances that warrant them giving less. Families should involve their children in tithing by teaching them through word and by example the priority of returning to God a portion of the blessing He has given us. Children may do this through tithing from monetary gifts that they receive, their allowances or income from part-time jobs.

The Benefits of Tithing: Those faithful Christians who do tithe (give sacrificially) report how remarkably their material needs have been met. Moreover, they will cite the following blessings as even greater, spiritual rewards:

- a sense of serenity and satisfaction that comes from generosity;
- an awareness that God comes first;
- the confidence of knowing that contributions are thoughtful giving and not mere leftovers or contributions of habit;
- an ability to distinguish between wants and needs;
- a deeper consciousness of society's materialism and consumerism;
- a keener appreciation of the world's poor and how we should and can alleviate their pain and poverty;
- a quiet and full trust in the Lord's protective care;
- a deep sense of satisfaction within the parish as a whole due to the amount of tithing by parish members.

Stewardship of Treasure Report: So far we have received 49 pledges for \$138,166. Thanks to everyone who has pledged so far. Please get your tithing card into us by October 23rd.
