



Baptism and Life

"Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what "life" really is. He begins to perceive the meaning of the word of hope that we encountered in the Baptismal Rite: from faith I await "eternal life" - the true life which, whole and unthreatened, in all its fullness, is simply life. Jesus, who said that he had come so that we might have life and have it in its fullness, in abundance (cf. Jn 10:10), has also explained to us what "life" means: "this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (Jn 17:3). Life in its true sense is not something we have exclusively in or from ourselves: it is a relationship. And life in its totality is a relationship with him who is the source of life. If we are in relation with him who does not die, who is Life itself and Love itself, then we are in life. Then we 'live'" – Pope Benedict XVI, Encyclical on Hope, November 30, 2007.

Many thanks for Tim Vaughn and all who assisted him with the Fr. Tharp's annual St. Ann Split the Pot. I drew the ticket at 7:00 p.m. in the office on New Year's Eve. (Our business manager has the video) The purchaser of the winning ticket (No. 04241) is located at a Cincinnati address, and purchased the ticket from their relatives who are St. Ann parishioners. The winner (net of IRS withholdings) and St. Ann each got half of the total pot of \$19,527.

Anniversary of Roe vs Wade

In 1973 (January 22 to be precise) the U.S. Supreme Court decided Roe versus Wade and effectively legitimized the practice of aborting unborn children in the United States. Forty nine years later, pro-life Christians gather to pray for a return to justice and the adherence to God's law that all human life is sacred and should be respected. The morning Mass on Saturday, January 22 will focus on prayer for the legal protection of unborn children.

Synod 2021-2023

(The Archdiocesan coordinator for the Worldwide Synod on Synodality has asked that this be posted in all bulletins:

The Holy Father has called a synod inviting ALL the Baptized to come together to discuss and discern how we can walk together in accomplishing the Mission of the Church. He wants ALL those who make up the Church to participate: elderly, youth, religious orders, clergy, lay faithful, poor, disabled, divorced, migrants, those who no longer practice the faith, etc. It is my understanding that the gathering for our deanery is scheduled for Saturday, January 22 at Queen of Peace Church in Millville. Reflection on Scripture

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is actually the First Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Advent purple and the Christmas white and red are replaced by the green of Ordinary Time. This color persists until March 2, Ash Wednesday. The liturgical term "ordinary time" does not mean bland or boring. It comes from the Latin "Ordo" meaning "list" or "calendar (list of days – one following another)."

But why did the Lord Jesus; the Son of God; the Second Person of the Holy Trinity; need to be baptized by John in the Jordan river? The answer is that he did not need to be baptized. In today's gospel and at the end of Matthew's gospel, Jesus establishes the Sacrament of Baptism as our rebirth into him! Jesus does what he does not because he needs it; he does what he does because "we" need it. Everything Jesus does, he does for the salvation of humanity. If we share in his death through baptism, we share in his resurrection because of our baptism into him.

Theme: The wedding in Cana

The Holy Father, in seeking to hear from all the People of God on how to better bring the Mission of the Church to the world, is calling for a synod. To start, he is asking for all dioceses throughout the world to conduct local meetings to discuss this very topic. Who are the People of God? It is all the baptized. That means not only the lay faithful, those in religious orders, and the clergy. It also means those who are marginalized, poor, disabled, migrants and immigrants, all ages young and old, and those who no longer practice the faith to name a few. In other words, everyone. Did you know that when you were baptized you were called to a priestly, prophetic, and kingly mission to bring the good news of salvation and discipleship to all? This duty then does not lie strictly with the clergy. The Holy Father recognizes that the Holy Spirit dwells within His people. So, coming together to discuss how to better further the mission of the Church is where the Holy Spirit can work powerfully.

We were able to help 41 families from Riverview School, St. Ann parish and our local community.


