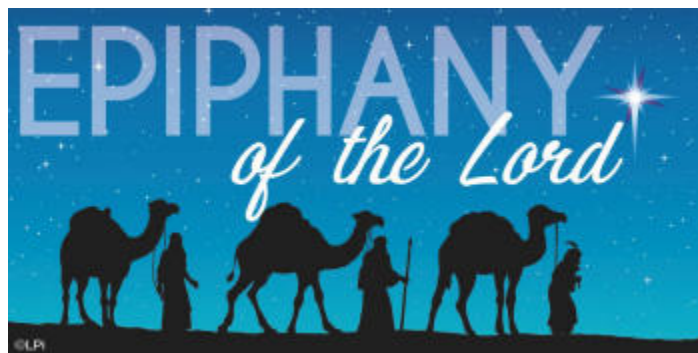

DO NOT FALL FOR SCAMS!!!!

I am told that unsuspecting parishioners have received texts, emails, and telephone solicitations (some mimicking my voice) asking for a “favor.” Be assured, it is NOT ME! All such messages are a SCAM. I promise that you will never receive any such messages from me, so if you receive one, do not even answer it. Delete any such message as I assure you I will NEVER contact you for a favor unless I am speaking to you physically in front of you at church. Don’t be fooled by these criminals.

Anniversary of Roe vs Wade

In 1973 (January 22 to be precise) the U.S. Supreme Court decided Roe versus Wade and effectively legitimized the practice of aborting unborn children in the United States. Forty nine years later, pro-life Christians gather to pray for a return to justice and the adherence to God’s law that all human life is sacred and should be respected. The morning Mass on Saturday, January 22 will focus on prayer for the legal protection of unborn children.

Synod 2021-2023

(The Archdiocesan coordinator for the Worldwide Synod on Synodality has asked that this be posted in all bulletins:

The Holy Father has called a synod inviting ALL the Baptized to come together to discuss and discern how we can walk together in accomplishing the Mission of the Church. He wants ALL those who make up the Church to participate: elderly, youth, religious orders, clergy, lay faithful, poor, disabled, divorced, migrants, those who no longer practice the faith, etc. It is my understanding that the gathering for our deanery is scheduled for Saturday, January 22 at Queen of Peace Church in Millville. Reflection on Scripture:

The word “Epiphany” is used to mean a startling awakening or realization. In Christian tradition, it is used to remind us of the story of the Magi reported in Matthew’s Gospel. But the real reason Matthew used the story of the Magi in his gospel was to assure the Jewish people that the whole world is coming to recognize Jesus as the Son of God and Savior of the World, while Israel was being left behind.

In the Book of Genesis, the first book of the Bible, after the great flood, Noah had three sons. Shem became the father of the people in Europe, Ham became the father of the people of Africa, and Japheth became the father of the people of Asia. For Matthew therefore, the Magi represent all the people throughout the whole world coming to recognize Jesus as Son of God and Savior of the world. From Matthew’s perspective, his brethren (the Jewish people) need to jump on the bandwagon and believe in Jesus.

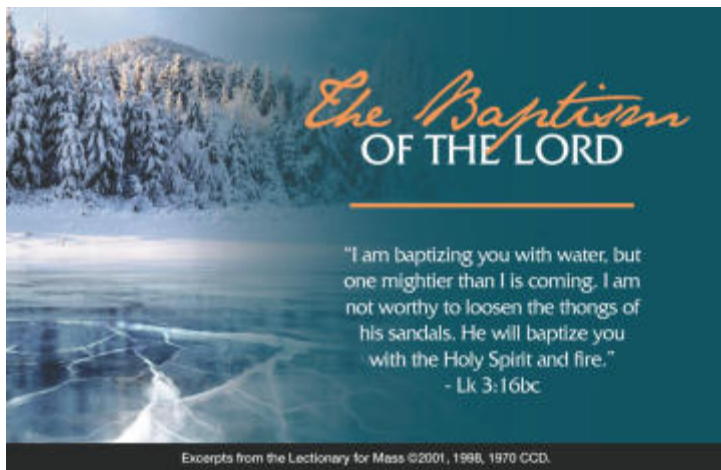
Therefore whether we have Jewish lineage or not; Epiphany is our feast when all the people through-out the whole world, without regard to race or ethnicity, color or culture, proclaim Jesus as our Lord and Savior. There is one faith, one hope, one baptism; and only one Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Throw all dissention and bigotry away; for we are one humanity, one Church in the Body of Christ.

THE EPIPHANY

In the Eastern Church, Epiphany commemorates the



Baptism of Our Lord. In the western Church, Epiphany commemorates the star and the arrival of the wise men, and the following Sunday is the Baptism of Our Lord.

Epiphany (the day) began in the Eastern Church as the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus Christ.

As the celebration of Christmas spread eastward, Epiphany changed to its present meaning. Some Oriental Christians have not yet acquired Christmas. For them, Epiphany, which they celebrate on January 6 of the Julian calendar, continues to be the celebration of the Nativity.

Since an epiphany is a realization, the Scriptures help us realize Jesus' identity, with a greater and greater scope. Its climax is the Transfiguration on the last Sunday after the Epiphany.

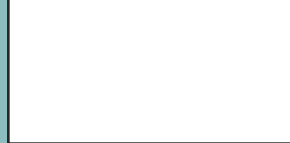

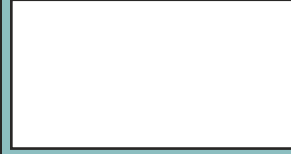
