The Importance of Sunday in the Catholic Church

Throughout the history of Christianity, Sunday has held a place of special importance. Early Christians celebrated Sunday, the first day of the week, as the Day that Jesus rose from the Dead. Because of the prominence of this day in Christian belief, they would gather together for Prayer and the Eucharist. As time went on, Sunday became the day of worship for the whole of Christianity.

For much of our American experience, Sunday was held in high esteem by our nation. Attending Church services on that day was as paramount to being a religious person. Not only did our citizens attend Church on that day, but for many it was a day for families to get together for a family meal. "Blue Laws" were established, in many places, forbidding non-essential stores to be open on Sundays so that people could follow through on their obligations to worship God.

In the recent years, the respect that our nation had for Sunday has been diminishing. The Blue Laws were rescinded, stores began to open their doors for shopping, and many families began to look upon Sunday solely as a day of relaxation, and not as a day of worship. The solemnity of Sunday has been losing ground, and fewer people see the importance of setting aside a day to build their relationship with God.

As Catholics, we need to take another look at our Faith in reference to the way we observe Sundays. If we find time to earn a living, find time for entertainment, find time to relax, why can't we find time to give God His due on one day out of the week? If you want to know what type of Catholic you are, take a good look at the way you attend Mass on weekends. Is it a part of your routine, or is it just an afterthought when you want to feel good about yourself?

Your relationship with God in your community is very important, because it helps to define who you are as a person. Our week should start with Sunday Mass. It is our way of telling God how much He means to us.

"Watch out for anger that can lead to vengeance; for laziness that leads to existential euthanasia; for pointing the finger at others, which leads to pride; and for complaining continually, which leads to desperation."

"Take care of brothers and sisters who are weaker ... the elderly, the sick, the hungry, the homeless and strangers, because we will be judged on this."

"Making sure your Christmas is about Jesus and not about shopping."

Year-End Giving

In this season of giving, consider making a year-end gift to our parish in gratitude for all the blessings you have received in life. As you plan to make the most of your charitable donations in 2020, know that we gratefully accept gifts of cash and appreciated assets such as stocks or bonds. **Even if you don't itemize your taxes, because of the new stimulus package passed by Congress, qualified charitable donations up to \$300 for individuals may be tax-deductible. The CARES Act legislation also temporarily suspended the limitation on qualified charitable contributions of cash, allowing for a current year deduction (for those who itemize) up to 100% of AGI. This provision is in effect only for the 2020 tax year.** And, if you are 70 1/2 or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish.

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend our priests and Seminarians in battle. Be their protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil.


Win for them the grace to be heroic in the pursuit and practice of virtue, courageous in fulfilling the will of God, and steadfast in the face of temptation and desolation.

Parish Communications

We are happy to announce that our Parish Office is now able to communicate via Constant Contact. This process will allow us to disseminate information in a more efficient and cost effective manner.

As a general rule, these communications will go out on Tuesday mornings. Because these are bulk emails, please be sure to check your junk or spam folders and adjust them accordingly.

Please know that your email address as well as any personal information will remain confidential. No information is divulged to a Third Party.

We would ask you to pass the word along to others in our parish family and encourage them to sign up with their email address as soon as possible. To sign up, simply go to our parish website (<http://saintmonicachurch.net>) and click on the Constant Contact sign up link. Increasing the number of people we have on board will make us continue to grow in our ability for efficient communications as well as create a positive impact to our parish finances.

Traditional mail takes about 2-4 days to be received. Constant Contact will allow you to receive information almost immediately. Using Constant Contact instead of traditional mail for large communications will create a savings of over 99% per communication. For example, on the average, sending a letter out to the entire parish costs about \$750 in postage. That same communication via Constant Contact will cost about \$7.50 - a savings of \$742.50 per mailing.



Moral Guidelines Regarding Vaccines and Covid – 19

With the prospect of the FDA approving one (or more) vaccines within the next few weeks, many questions have been raised regarding the ethical status of these vaccines, particularly questioning whether embryonic stem cells or tissue from aborted fetuses were used in their creation, and whether Catholics can morally receive such vaccines. The Diocese has released a document prepared by Fr. Koopman, a Moral Theologian from St. May Seminary. It is rather lengthy, and talks about the morality of vaccines in general, so we will print the final conclusion.

“In conclusion, at this point there appears to be no moral issues to prohibit a Catholic from receiving vaccines produced by Pfizer or Moderna. If other vaccines are released which do have recourse to material of illicit origin, Catholic moral teaching would direct Catholics to utilize the option that is least morally problematic (i.e., the vaccines that were not created via such immoral means). Providentially, these two listed vaccines satisfy that criteria.”
